A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to creating the position of Native American liaison.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 405, Government Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER D. NATIVE AMERICAN LIAISON
7	Sec. 405.151. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, "liaison"
8	means the Native American liaison.
9	Sec. 405.152. APPOINTMENT. (a) The governor shall appoint
10	a liaison to serve within the office of the secretary of state. The
11	individual appointed must meet the eligibility requirements of
12	Section 405.153 and be selected from names submitted by the
13	legislature, federally recognized Native American tribes, or other
14	interested persons.
15	(b) The governor shall make every effort to appoint an
16	individual of Native American descent as liaison.
17	Sec. 405.153. ELIGIBILITY FOR APPOINTMENT. To be eligible
18	for appointment under Section 405.152, the individual must be:
19	(1) knowledgeable about the Native American tribes of
20	this state and the opportunities and challenges facing the tribes;
21	and
22	(2) experienced in working with Native Americans.
23	Sec. 405.154. TERM. The liaison serves at the will of the
24	governor.

- Sec. 405.155. TOLL-FREE TELEPHONE NUMBER. The secretary of
- 2 state shall provide a toll-free telephone number for use by the
- 3 public in contacting the liaison.
- 4 Sec. 405.156. WEBSITE. The secretary of state shall
- 5 provide on its Internet website information regarding the liaison,
- 6 including the liaison's name, mailing address, facsimile number,
- 7 <u>telephone number, and electronic mail address.</u>
- 8 Sec. 405.157. PUBLIC RELATIONS. (a) The liaison shall
- 9 <u>assist the Native American community of this state in establishing</u>
- 10 and maintaining mutual understanding and cooperation with this
- 11 state, the federal government, local governments, and other
- 12 entities that affect the community. The liaison shall improve
- 13 government relations on all levels within a framework of
- 14 sovereighty.
- 15 (b) The liaison shall assist the Native American tribes of
- this state in gaining federal recognition.
- 17 (c) The liaison shall make efforts to increase awareness and
- 18 concern for Native American issues.
- 19 Sec. 405.158. IDENTIFICATION OF SERVICES AND OTHER
- 20 RESOURCES. (a) The liaison shall identify public and private
- 21 <u>resources available to Native Americans in this state and develop</u>
- 22 <u>recommendations and strategies to maximize the acquisition and use</u>
- 23 of those resources.
- 24 (b) The liaison shall make efforts to facilitate the
- 25 coordination of state agency services for Native Americans in this
- 26 state.
- Sec. 405.159. RESEARCH REQUIRED. (a) The liaison shall

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- 1 study the living conditions, employment, health, education,
- 2 <u>financial</u> status, recreation, social adjustment, and other
- 3 conditions affecting the welfare and culture of Native Americans in
- 4 this state.
- 5 (b) The liaison shall collect statistics and other facts
- 6 necessary to develop an accurate understanding of the Native
- 7 American community in this state.
- 8 Sec. 405.160. BIENNIAL REPORT. Not later than November 1 of
- 9 each even-numbered year, the liaison shall prepare and submit to
- 10 the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house
- of representatives a report with recommendations regarding Native
- 12 American issues.
- SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2003, the governor
- 14 shall appoint the Native American liaison under Section 405.152,
- 15 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. (a) The Native American liaison appointed under
- 17 Section 405.152, Government Code, as added by this Act, shall
- 18 develop recommendations for the 79th Legislature regarding the
- 19 feasibility and benefits of establishing a state recognition
- 20 program for the Native American tribes of this state.
- 21 (b) Not later than November 1, 2004, the liaison shall
- provide the first biennial recommendations under Section 405.160,
- 23 Government Code, as added by this Act, to the governor, the
- 24 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 25 representatives.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
