8	HOSPITAL CARE. <u>(a)</u> Beginning on the date on which taxes are
9	collected for the district, the district assumes full
10	responsibility for furnishing medical and hospital care for
11	indigent and needy persons residing in the district.
12	(b) A person may not be considered to reside in the district

14	solely to obtain medical or hospital care from the district.
15	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 281, Health and Safety

17	Sec. 281.074. AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO CERTAIN
18	PERSONS. The district may provide nonemergency medical treatment

1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
