A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to prohibiting certain foreign corporations from
3	participating in state contracts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 2155, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 2155.0775 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2155.0775. CERTAIN FOREIGN CORPORATIONS BARRED FROM
8	PARTICIPATION IN STATE CONTRACTS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Domestic" means created or organized in the
10	United States or under the law of the United States or any state.
11	(2) "Expanded affiliated group" has the meaning
12	assigned to "affiliated group" by Section 1504(a), Internal Revenue
13	Code of 1986, as that section existed on January 1, 2003.
14	(3) "Foreign" means created or organized in a country
15	other than the United States or under the law of a country other
16	than the United States.
17	(4) "Transaction" includes a series of transactions.
18	(b) A foreign corporation may not participate in state
19	contracts that are subject to this subtitle, including contracts
20	for which purchasing authority is delegated to a state agency, if:
21	(1) the foreign corporation acquires directly or
22	indirectly substantially all of the properties held directly or
23	indirectly by a domestic corporation; and
24	(2) immediately after the acquisition, more than 80

- 1 percent of the stock, by vote or value, of the foreign corporation
- 2 is held by former shareholders of the domestic corporation by
- 3 reason of holding stock in the domestic corporation.
- 4 (c) A foreign corporation may not participate in state
- 5 contracts that are subject to this subtitle, including contracts
- 6 for which purchasing authority is delegated to a state agency, if:
- 7 (1) the foreign corporation acquires directly or
- 8 indirectly properties constituting a trade or business of a
- 9 domestic partnership;
- 10 (2) immediately after the acquisition and without
- 11 regard to stock of the foreign corporation which is sold in a public
- offering related to the acquisition, more than 80 percent of the
- 13 stock, by vote or value, of the foreign corporation is held by
- 14 former partners of the domestic partnership;
- 15 (3) the foreign corporation does not have substantial
- 16 <u>business activities in the foreign country in which or under the law</u>
- of which the corporation is created or organized when compared to
- 18 the total business activities of the expanded affiliated group; and
- 19 <u>(4) the stock of the foreign corporation is publicly</u>
- 20 traded and the principal market for the public trading of the stock
- 21 is in the United States.
- 22 (d) Subsection (b)(2) shall be applied by substituting "50
- 23 percent" for "80 percent" with respect to a foreign corporation if:
- 24 (1) the corporation does not have substantial business
- 25 activities in the foreign country in which or under the law of which
- 26 the corporation is created or organized when compared to the total
- 27 business activities of the expanded affiliated group; and

- 1 (2) the stock of the corporation is publicly traded
- 2 and the principal market for the public trading of the stock is in
- 3 the United States.
- 4 (e) For the purposes of this section, stock held by members
- 5 of an expanded affiliated group that includes the foreign
- 6 corporation shall not be taken into account in determining
- 7 ownership.
- 8 SECTION 2. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to state
- 9 contracting procedures apply only to a contract executed on or
- 10 after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 (b) A contract executed before the effective date of this
- 12 Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the
- 13 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 14 that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
