9	(b) The commission may obtain criminal history record

13	SECTION 4. Section 504.152, Occupations Code, is amended to

- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c) of this section,
 the changes in law made by this Act apply only to an initial
 application made to the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse
 for a chemical dependency counseling license issued as provided by
 Chapter 504, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, on or after
 the effective date of this Act. An application for a chemical
- 8 dependency counseling license made to the Texas Commission on
- 9 Alcohol and Drug Abuse before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law as it existed before that date, and that law is

- 12 (c) The changes in law made by this Act do not apply to a
- 13 person who has completed the requirements for intern registration

- 17 the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2004.
