- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 504.057, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 504.057. [CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION FOR] COUNSELOR
- 7 INTERNS. (a) The commission by rule shall establish eligibility
- 8 requirements for registration as a counselor intern under this
- 9 chapter.
- 10 (b) The commission may obtain criminal history record
- 11 information relating to a counselor intern or an applicant for
- 12 registration as a counselor intern [a person described by Section
- 13 504.002(b)(2) from the Department of Public Safety and the Federal
- 14 Bureau of Investigation.
- (c) [(b)] The commission may adopt rules as necessary to
- 16 implement the commission's authority under this section, including
- 17 rules that restrict the ability of a $\underline{\text{counselor intern}}$ [$\underline{\text{person}}$
- 18 described by Section 504.002(b)(2) to engage in chemical
- 19 dependency counseling if the person has been convicted or placed on
- 20 community supervision for an offense described by Section
- 21 504.1525(a)(1) or (2).
- SECTION 2. Section 504.152, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- Sec. 504.152. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. To be eligible

- 1 for a license under this chapter, a person must:
- 2 (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- 3 (2) <u>hold an associate degree or a more advanced degree</u>
- 4 [have a high school diploma or its equivalent];
- 5 (3) have completed:
- 6 (A) an appropriate course of study approved by
- 7 the commission, which may be included in the course work completed
- 8 in connection with the person's degree [270 classroom hours of
- 9 approved curricula]; and
- 10 (B) 4,000 hours of approved supervised
- 11 experience working with chemically dependent persons[; and]
- 12 [(C) 300 hours of approved supervised field work
- 13 practicum];
- 14 (4) provide two letters of reference from chemical
- 15 dependency counselors;
- 16 (5) pass a written examination approved by the
- 17 commission;
- 18 (6) submit a case presentation to the test
- 19 administrator;
- 20 (7) pass an oral examination approved by the
- 21 commission;
- 22 (8) be determined by the commission to be worthy of the
- 23 public trust and confidence;
- 24 (9) successfully complete the chemical dependency
- counselor examination under Section 504.156; and
- 26 (10) sign a written agreement to comply with the

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 504.153(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) An applicant is exempt from the <u>requirement of Section</u>
- 4 [requirements of Sections] 504.152(3)(A) [and (C)] if the applicant
- 5 holds a baccalaureate degree or a more advanced degree in:
- 6 (1) chemical dependency counseling; or
- 7 (2) psychology, sociology, or any other related
- 8 program approved by the commission.
- 9 SECTION 4. Not later than March 1, 2004, the Texas
- 10 Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse shall:
- 11 (1) by rule establish the counselor intern eligibility
- 12 requirements under Section 504.057, Occupations Code, as amended by

- 14 (2) adopt the rules required by Section 504.152,

- SECTION 5. (a) A person who holds a license as a chemical
- 17 dependency counselor before the effective date of this Act may

- 21 the changes in law made by this Act apply only to an initial

- governed by the law as it existed before that date, and that law is 1 2 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 The changes in law made by this Act do not apply to a 4 person who has completed the requirements for intern registration 5 and submitted an application for registration as a counselor intern 6 as described by Section 504.057(a), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, with the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse before 7
- the effective date of this Act. 8
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2004, except 9 that Sections 1 and 4 take effect September 1, 2003. 10
