A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to student center fees at Stephen F. Austin State

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 54.520, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read

7 as follows:

- 8 (a) To the extent approved by the students under Subsection
- 9 (b) of this section, the board of regents of Stephen F. Austin State $\,$
- 10 University may charge each student enrolled in one or more courses
- 11 conducted by [on the main campus of] the university a regular, fixed
- 12 fee, not to exceed \$100 [\$15] per student for each semester of the
- long session and not to exceed \$50 [\$7.50] per student for all or
- 14 part of each six-week term of the summer session, for the purpose of
- 15 <u>acquiring</u>, constructing, renovating, operating, maintaining,
- 16 improving, equipping, and financing a [the] university center [and
- $\frac{\text{acquiring}}{\text{or}}$ or $\frac{\text{constructing}}{\text{additions}}$ additions to the center. $\frac{\text{The amount}}{\text{or}}$
- 18 of the fee may be changed at any time within the limits specified in
- 19 order to provide sufficient funds to support the university
- 20 center. The fees authorized in this section supplement any other
- 21 use or service fee authorized by law.
- (b) The decision to levy [such] a fee under this section and
- 23 [τ] the amount of the initial fee[τ and any increase in the fee]

- 2 (d) To provide sufficient money to support the university
- 3 center, the board of regents may increase the amount of a fee

- 10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to fees imposed for a semester or term that begins on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
