4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 547.613,
6	Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
7	(b) This section does not apply to:
8	(1) a windshield that has a sunscreening device that:
9	(A) <u>in combination with the windshield</u> has a
10	light transmission of 25 [33] percent or more;
11	(B) <u>in combination with the windshield</u> has a
12	luminous reflectance of 25 [35] percent or less;
13	(C) is not red <u>, blue,</u> or amber; and
14	(D) does not extend downward beyond the AS-1 line
15	or more than five inches from the top of the windshield, whichever
16	is closer to the top of the windshield;
17	(2) a [front side] wing vent or <u>a</u> window <u>other than a</u>
18	windshield if the vent or window[, a side window to the rear of the
19	vehicle operator, or a rear window that] has a sunscreening device
20	that in combination with the vent or window has:
21	<u>(A)</u> a light transmission of <u>25</u> [35] percent or
22	more; and
23	(B) a luminous reflectance of 25 [35] percent or
24	less;

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1 (3) a rear window, if the motor vehicle is equipped 2 with an outside mirror on each side of the vehicle that reflects to 3 the vehicle operator a view of the highway for a distance of at 4 least 200 feet from the rear;

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(4) a rearview mirror;

6 (5) an adjustable nontransparent sun visor that is 7 mounted in front of a side window and not attached to the glass;

8 (6) a direction, destination, or termination sign on a 9 passenger common carrier motor vehicle, if the sign does not 10 interfere with the vehicle operator's view of approaching traffic;

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(8) a rear trunk lid handle or hinge;

13 (9) a luggage rack attached to the rear trunk;

(7) a rear window wiper motor;

14 (10) a side window that is to the rear of the vehicle 15 operator on a multipurpose vehicle;

16 (11) a window that has a United States, state, or local
17 certificate placed on or attached to it as required by law;

18 (12) a motor vehicle that is not registered in this 19 state;

(13) <u>a window that complies with federal standards for</u> window materials, including a factory-tinted or a pretinted window installed by the vehicle manufacturer, or a replacement window meeting the specifications required by the vehicle manufacturer [a motor vehicle with a manufacturer's model year before 1988]; (14) a vehicle that is:

26 (A) used regularly to transport passengers for a27 fee; and

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(B) authorized to operate under license or permit
 by a local authority; or

3 (15) a vehicle that is maintained by a law enforcement4 agency and used for law enforcement purposes.

5 (c) A manufacturer shall certify to the department that the 6 sunscreening device made or assembled by the manufacturer complies luminous 7 with the light transmission and reflectance specifications established by Subsection (b) for sunscreening 8 9 devices in combination with a window.

10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 11 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 12 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 13 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 14 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 15 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 16 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
