Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 29.0821 to read as follows: 7 8 Sec. 29.0821. OPTIONAL FLEXIBLE YEAR PROGRAM. (a) A school district may provide a flexible year program for students 9 who did not or are likely not to perform successfully on an 10 11 assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023 or who 12 would not otherwise be promoted to the next grade level. 13 (b) To enable a school district to provide additional 14 instructional days for a program under this section, with the approval of the commissioner, a school district may: 15 (1) provide a number of days of instruction during the 16 regular school year that is not more than 10 days fewer than the 17 18 number required under Section 25.081(a); and (2) use for instructional purposes not more than five 19 days that would otherwise be used for staff development or teacher 20 21 preparation. 22 (c) Notwithstanding any reduction in the number of instructional days in the regular school year or in the number of 23 staff development days, each educator employed under a 10-month 24

3	(d) A school district may require educational support
4	personnel to provide service as necessary for an optional flexible
