2 Relating to authorizing the issuance of revenue bonds for the 3 University of Houston for recovery from Tropical Storm Allison 4 recovery. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 55.17393 (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this subchapter, the board of regents of the 7 University of Houston System may acquire, purchase, construct, 8 improve, renovate, enlarge, or equip property, buildings, 9 10 structures, facilities, roads, or related infrastructure for the University of Houston to be financed by the issuance of bonds in 11 12 accordance with this subchapter and in accordance with a systemwide 13 revenue financing program adopted by the board in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$25 million. 14 (b) The board may pledge irrevocably to the payment of those bonds 15 all or any part of the revenue funds of an institution, branch, or 16 entity of the University of Houston System, including student 17 tuition charges required or authorized by law to be imposed on 18 students enrolled at an institution, branch, or entity of the 19 University of Houston System. The amount of a pledge made under 20 this subsection may not be reduced or abrogated while the bonds for 21 22 which the pledge is made, or bonds issued to refund those bonds, are 23 outstanding. (c) If sufficient funds are not available to the board to meet its 24

- obligations under this section, the board may transfer funds among
- 2 institutions, branches, and entities of the University of Houston
- 3 System to ensure the most equitable and efficient allocation of
- 4 available resources for each institution, branch, or entity to
- 5 carry out its duties and purposes.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
