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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to reimbursement under certain health benefit plans for 3 services provided by licensed athletic trainers.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subsection (B), Section 2, Chapter 397, Acts of 6 the 54th Legislature, Regular Session, 1955 (Article 3.70-2, 7 Vernon's Texas Insurance Code), is amended to read as follows:

No policy of accident and sickness insurance shall make 8 (B) benefits contingent upon treatment or examination by a particular 9 practitioner or by particular practitioners of the healing arts 10 hereinafter designated unless such policy contains a provision 11 12 designating the practitioner or practitioners who will be 13 recognized by the insurer and those who will not be recognized by the insurer. Such provision may be located in the "Exceptions" or 14 15 "Exceptions and Reductions" provisions, or elsewhere in the policy, or by endorsement attached to the policy, at the insurer's option. 16 In designating the practitioners who will and will not be 17 recognized, such provision shall use the following terms: Doctor 18 19 of Medicine, Doctor of Osteopathy, Doctor of Dentistry, Doctor of Chiropractic, Doctor of Optometry, Doctor of Podiatry, Licensed 20 Audiologist, Licensed Speech-language Pathologist, Doctor 21 in 22 Psychology, Licensed Master Social Worker--Advanced Clinical Practitioner, Licensed Dietitian, Licensed Professional Counselor, 23 24 Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, Licensed Chemical

Dependency Counselor, Licensed Hearing Instrument Fitter and
 Dispenser, Advanced Practice Nurse, Physician Assistant, Licensed
 Occupational Therapist, Licensed Physical Therapist, Licensed
 Acupuncturist, Licensed Psychological Associate, [and] Licensed
 Surgical Assistant, and Licensed Athletic Trainer.

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For purposes of this Act, such designations shall have thefollowing meanings:

B Doctor of Medicine: One licensed by the Texas State Board of
9 Medical Examiners on the basis of the degree "Doctor of Medicine";

Doctor of Osteopathy: One licensed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners on the basis of the degree of "Doctor of Osteopathy";

13 Doctor of Dentistry: One licensed by the State Board of 14 Dental Examiners;

Doctor of Chiropractic: One licensed by the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners;

Doctor of Optometry: One licensed by the Texas Optometry Board;

Doctor of Podiatry: One licensed by the Texas State Board of
Podiatric Medical Examiners;

Licensed Audiologist: One with a master's or doctorate degree in audiology from an accredited college or university and who is licensed as an audiologist by the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;

Licensed Speech-language Pathologist: One with a master's or doctorate degree in speech pathology or speech-language pathology from an accredited college or university and who is licensed as a

speech-language pathologist by the State Board of Examiners for
 Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;

3 Doctor in Psychology: One licensed by the Texas State Board 4 of Examiners of Psychologists and certified as a Health Service 5 Provider;

6 Licensed Master Social Worker--Advanced Clinical 7 Practitioner: One licensed by the Texas State Board of Social 8 Worker Examiners as a Licensed Master Social Worker with the order 9 of recognition of Advanced Clinical Practitioner;

10 Licensed Dietitian: One licensed by the Texas State Board of 11 Examiners of Dietitians;

Licensed Professional Counselor: One licensed by the TexasState Board of Examiners of Professional Counselors;

Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist: One licensed by the
Texas State Board of Examiners of Marriage and Family Therapists;

16 Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor: One licensed by the 17 Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse;

18 Licensed Hearing Instrument Fitter and Dispenser: One 19 licensed by the State Committee of Examiners in the Fitting and 20 Dispensing of Hearing Instruments;

Advanced Practice Nurse: One licensed by the Board of Nurse Examiners as a registered nurse and recognized by that board as an advanced practice nurse;

24 Physician Assistant: One licensed by the Texas State Board 25 of Physician Assistant Examiners;

26 Licensed Occupational Therapist: One licensed by the Texas 27 Board of Occupational Therapy Examiners;

Licensed Physical Therapist: One licensed by the Texas Board
 of Physical Therapy Examiners;

3 Licensed Acupuncturist: One licensed by the Texas State4 Board of Medical Examiners as an acupuncturist;

5 Licensed Psychological Associate: One licensed by the Texas 6 State Board of Examiners of Psychologists and practicing under the 7 supervision of a licensed psychologist; [and]

8 Licensed Surgical Assistant: One licensed by the Texas State
9 Board of Medical Examiners as a surgical assistant; and

10 Licensed Athletic Trainer: One licensed by the Advisory
11 Board of Athletic Trainers.

SECTION 2. Section 3, Article 3.70-3C, Insurance Code, as added by Chapter 1024, Acts of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997, is amended by adding Subsection (p) to read as follows:

16 (p) A preferred provider may not refuse to contract with an 17 athletic trainer, as defined by Section 451.001, Occupations Code, 18 to be included in the provider's network or refuse to reimburse the 19 athletic trainer for a covered service that a physician has 20 requested the athletic trainer to perform.

21 SECTION 3. Section 1, Article 21.52, Insurance Code, as 22 amended by Chapters 812 and 1014, Acts of the 77th Legislature, 23 Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as follows:

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Sec. 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this article:

(a) "health insurance policy" means any individual,
 group, blanket, or franchise insurance policy, insurance
 agreement, or group hospital service contract, providing benefits

1 for medical or surgical expenses incurred as a result of an accident
2 or sickness;

3 (b) "doctor of podiatric medicine" includes D.P.M.,
4 podiatrist, doctor of surgical chiropody, D.S.C. and chiropodist;

5 (c) "doctor of optometry" includes optometrist, 6 doctor of optometry, and O.D.;

7 (d) "doctor of chiropractic" means a person who is
8 licensed by the Texas Board of Chiropractic Examiners to practice
9 chiropractic;

10 (e) "licensed dentist" means a person who is licensed
11 to practice dentistry by the State Board of Dental Examiners;

(f) "licensed audiologist" means a person who has received a master's or doctorate degree in audiology from an accredited college or university and is licensed as an audiologist by the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;

(g) "licensed speech-language pathologist" means a person who has received a master's or doctorate degree in speech-language pathology from an accredited college or university and is licensed as a speech-language pathologist by the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology;

(h) "licensed master social worker--advanced clinical
practitioner" means a person who is licensed by the Texas State
Board of Social Worker Examiners as a licensed master social worker
with the order of recognition of advanced clinical practitioner;

(i) "licensed dietitian" means a person who is
licensed by the Texas State Board of Examiners of Dietitians;

(j) "licensed professional counselor" means a person
 who is licensed by the Texas State Board of Examiners of
 Professional Counselors;

4 (k) "psychologist" means a person licensed to practice
5 psychology by the Texas State Board of Examiners of Psychologists;

6 (1) "licensed marriage and family therapist" means a 7 person who is licensed by the Texas State Board of Examiners of 8 Marriage and Family Therapists;

9 (m) "licensed chemical dependency counselor" means a 10 person who is licensed by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug 11 Abuse;

(n) "licensed hearing instrument fitter and
 dispenser" means a person who is licensed by the State Committee of
 Examiners in the Fitting and Dispensing of Hearing Instruments;

(o) "licensed psychological associate" means a person who is licensed by the Texas State Board of Examiners of Psychologists and who practices under the supervision of a licensed psychologist;

(p) "occupational therapist" means a person who is licensed to practice occupational therapy by the Texas Board of Occupational Therapy Examiners;

(q) "physical therapist" means a person who practices physical therapy and is licensed by the Texas Board of Physical Therapy Examiners;

(r) "advanced practice nurse" means a person licensed
 by the Board of Nurse Examiners and recognized by that board as an
 advanced practice nurse;

(s) "licensed acupuncturist" means a person licensed
 to practice acupuncture by the Texas State Board of Medical
 Examiners;

4 (t) "physician assistant" means a person licensed by 5 the Texas State Board of Physician Assistant Examiners; [and]

6 (u) "nurse first assistant" has the meaning assigned
7 by Section 301.1525, Occupations Code; [-]

8 <u>(v)</u> [(u)] "Surgical assistant" means a person licensed 9 by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners as a surgical 10 assistant<u>; and</u>

11 (w) "licensed athletic trainer" means a person 12 licensed by the Advisory Board of Athletic Trainers.

13 SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 3, Article 21.52, 14 Insurance Code, as amended by Chapters 812 and 1014, Acts of the 15 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as 16 follows:

(a) Any person who is issued, who is a party to, or who is a beneficiary under any health insurance policy delivered, renewed, or issued for delivery in this state by any insurance company, association, or organization to which this article applies may select:

(1) a licensed doctor of podiatric medicine, a
licensed dentist, or a doctor of chiropractic to perform the
medical or surgical services or procedures scheduled in the policy
which fall within the scope of the license of that practitioner;

26 (2) a licensed doctor of optometry to perform the27 services or procedures scheduled in the policy which fall within

1 the scope of the license of that doctor of optometry;

2 (3) an occupational therapist to provide the services
3 scheduled in the policy which fall within the scope of the license
4 of that occupational therapist;

5 (4) a physical therapist to provide the services 6 scheduled in the policy which fall within the scope of the license 7 of that physical therapist;

8 (5) a licensed audiologist to measure hearing for the 9 purpose of determining the presence or extent of a hearing loss and 10 to provide aural rehabilitation services to a person with a hearing 11 loss if those services or procedures are scheduled in the policy;

12 (6) a licensed speech-language pathologist to 13 evaluate speech and language and to provide habilitative and 14 rehabilitative services to restore speech or language loss or to 15 correct a speech or language impairment if those services or 16 procedures are scheduled in the policy;

social 17 licensed master worker--advanced (7) a 18 clinical practitioner to provide the services that fall within the scope of the license of such certified practitioner and which are 19 specified as services within the terms of the policy of insurance, 20 including the provision of direct, diagnostic, preventive, or 21 22 clinical services to individuals, families, and groups whose functioning is threatened or affected by social or psychological 23 stress or health impairment, if those services or procedures are 24 25 scheduled in the policy;

(8) a licensed dietitian including a provisional
 licensed dietitian under a licensed dietitian's supervision to

1 provide the services that fall within the scope of the license of 2 that dietitian if those services are scheduled in the policy;

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3 (9) a licensed professional counselor to provide the 4 services that fall within the scope of the license of that 5 professional if those services are scheduled in the policy;

6 (10) a licensed marriage and family therapist to 7 provide the services that fall within the scope of the license of 8 that professional if those services are scheduled in the policy;

9 (11) a psychologist to perform the services or 10 procedures scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the 11 license of that psychologist;

(12) a licensed chemical dependency counselor to perform the services or procedures scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the license of that practitioner;

(13) a licensed acupuncturist to perform the services or procedures scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the license of that practitioner;

18 (14) an advanced practice nurse to provide the 19 services scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the 20 license of that practitioner;

(15) a physician assistant to provide the services scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the license of that practitioner;

(16) a licensed hearing instrument fitter and dispenser to provide the services or procedures scheduled in the policy that fall within the scope of the license of that practitioner;

(17) a licensed psychological associate to provide the 1 2 services that fall within the scope of the license of that professional if those services are scheduled in the policy; [or] 3 4 (18) [(17)] a licensed surgical assistant to provide the services or procedures scheduled in the policy that fall within 5 the scope of the license of that practitioner; [or] 6 7 (19) [(18)] a nurse first assistant to provide the services scheduled in the policy that: 8 9 (A) fall within the scope of the license of that 10 practitioner; and 11 (B) are requested by the physician whom the nurse 12 is assisting; or 13 (20) a licensed athletic trainer to provide the services that fall within the scope of the license of that 14 15 professional if those services are scheduled in the policy. 16 SECTION 5. Subsection (c), Section 3, Article 21.52, Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows: 17 (C) The payment or reimbursement by the insurance company, 18 association, or organization for services or procedures 19 in 20 accordance with the payment schedule or the payment provisions in the policy shall not be denied because the same were performed by a 21 22 licensed doctor of podiatric medicine, a licensed doctor of optometry, a licensed doctor of chiropractic, a licensed dentist, 23 an occupational therapist, a physical therapist, a licensed 24 25 audiologist, a licensed speech-language pathologist, a licensed master social worker--advanced clinical practitioner, a licensed 26 27 dietitian, a licensed professional counselor, a licensed marriage

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and family therapist, a psychologist, a licensed psychological associate, a licensed chemical dependency counselor, an advanced practice nurse, a nurse first assistant, a physician assistant, a licensed acupuncturist, [or] a licensed hearing instrument fitter and dispenser, or a licensed athletic trainer.

6 SECTION 6. Subsection (d), Section 3, Article 21.52, 7 Insurance Code, as amended by Chapters 812 and 1014, Acts of the 8 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as 9 follows:

(d) There shall not be any classification, differentiation, 10 11 or other discrimination in the payment schedule or the payment 12 provisions in a health insurance policy, nor in the amount or manner 13 of payment or reimbursement thereunder, between scheduled services or procedures when performed by a doctor of podiatric medicine, a 14 15 doctor of optometry, a doctor of chiropractic, a licensed dentist, 16 an occupational therapist, a physical therapist, a licensed athletic trainer, licensed 17 а audiologist, а licensed speech-language pathologist, licensed master social 18 а worker--advanced clinical practitioner, a licensed dietitian, a 19 licensed professional counselor, a licensed marriage and family 20 therapist, a psychologist, a licensed psychological associate, a 21 22 licensed chemical dependency counselor, an advanced practice nurse to provide the services scheduled in the policy, a nurse first 23 assistant to provide the services scheduled in the policy and 24 25 requested by the physician whom the nurse is assisting, a physician assistant to provide the services scheduled in the policy, a 26 27 licensed acupuncturist, or a licensed hearing instrument fitter and

dispenser which fall within the scope of that practitioner's 1 2 license or certification and the same services or procedures when 3 performed by any other practitioner of the healing arts whose 4 services or procedures are covered by the policy. However, a health insurance policy may provide for a different amount of payment or 5 6 reimbursement for scheduled services or procedures when performed 7 by an advanced practice nurse, a nurse first assistant, licensed surgical assistant, or physician assistant 8 provided the 9 reimbursement methodology used to calculate the payment for the 10 service or procedure is the same methodology used to calculate the 11 payment when the service or procedure is provided by a physician.

SECTION 7. Subchapter I, Chapter 843, Insurance Code, as effective June 1, 2003, is amended by adding Section 843.3121 to read as follows:

Sec. 843.3121. ATHLETIC TRAINERS. A health maintenance organization may not refuse to contract with an athletic trainer, as defined by Section 451.001, Occupations Code, to be included in the organization's provider network or refuse to reimburse the athletic trainer for a covered service that a physician has requested the athletic trainer to perform.

SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and applies only to a health insurance policy or contract or an evidence of coverage that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2004. A health insurance policy or contract or an evidence of coverage that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2004, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is

1 continued in effect for that purpose.
