AN ACT

- Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Subsection (e), Section 81.042, Health 5 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 The following persons shall report to the local health authority or the department a suspected case of a reportable 8 disease and all information known concerning the person who has or 9 is suspected of having the disease if a report is not made as 10
- required by Subsections (a)-(d): 11
- a professional registered nurse; 12 (1)
- 13 (2) an administrator or director of a public or private temporary or permanent child-care facility; 14
- 15 (3) an administrator or director of a nursing home,
- personal care home, maternity home, adult respite care center, or 16
- adult day-care center; 17

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- an administrator of a home health agency; 18
- an administrator or health official of a public or 19 private institution of higher education; 20
- (6) an owner or manager of a restaurant, dairy, or 21
- 22 other food handling or processing establishment or outlet;
- 24 public or private camp, home, or institution;

(7) a superintendent, manager, or health official of a

- 2 (9) a health professional; [or]
- 3 (10) an administrator or health official of a penal or
- 4 correctional institution; or
- 5 (11) emergency medical service personnel, a peace
- 6 officer, or a firefighter.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 562.055 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 562.055. REPORT TO TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. A
- 10 pharmacist shall report any unusual or increased prescription
- 11 rates, unusual types of prescriptions, or unusual trends in
- 12 pharmacy visits that may be caused by bioterrorism, epidemic or
- 13 pandemic disease, or novel and highly fatal infectious agents or
- 14 biological toxins that might pose a substantial risk of a
- 15 significant number of human fatalities or incidents of permanent or
- 16 long-term disability. Prescription-related events that require a
- 17 report include:
- 18 (1) an unusual increase in the number of prescriptions
- 19 to treat respiratory or gastrointestinal complaints or fever;
- 20 (2) an unusual increase in the number of prescriptions
- 21 for antibiotics;
- 22 (3) an unusual increase in the number of requests for
- 23 <u>information</u> on <u>over-the-counter</u> <u>pharmaceuticals</u> to <u>treat</u>
- 24 respiratory or gastrointestinal complaints or fever; and
- 25 (4) any prescription that treats a disease that is
- 26 relatively uncommon and has bioterrorism potential.

     commission may adopt rules that require a veterinarian, a

     veterinary diagnostic laboratory, or a person having care, custody,

     or control of an animal to report the existence of a disease other
     than bluetongue in an animal to the commission within 24 hours after
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     diagnosis if the disease:
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Agriculture Code, are amended to read as follows:

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- 1 (1) is recognized by the United States Department of
- 2 Agriculture as a foreign animal disease;
- 3 (2) is the subject of a cooperative eradication
- 4 program with the United States Department of Agriculture;

- 9 (c) The commission may adopt rules that require
- 10 veterinarian, a veterinary diagnostic laboratory, or a person
- 11 <u>having care, custody, or control of an animal</u> to report a disease
- 12 not covered by Subsection (a) or (b) if the commission determines
- that action to be necessary for the protection of animal health in
- 14 this state. The commission shall immediately deliver a copy of a
- 15 rule adopted under this subsection to the appropriate legislative
- 16 oversight committees. A rule adopted by the commission under this
- 17 subsection expires on the first day after the last day of the first
- 18 regular legislative session that begins after adoption of the rule
- 19 unless the rule is continued in effect by act of the legislature.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
