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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 81.095(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- (b) This subsection applies only in a case of accidental 7 exposure of certified emergency medical services personnel, a 8 firefighter, a peace officer, or a first responder who renders 9 assistance at the scene of an emergency or during transport to the 10 hospital to blood or other body fluids of a patient who is 11 12 transported to a licensed hospital. The hospital receiving the patient, following a report of the exposure incident, shall take 13 14 reasonable steps to test the patient for hepatitis B or hepatitis C if the report shows there is significant risk to the person exposed. 15 The [person exposed, or the] organization that employs the person 16 or for which the person works as a volunteer in connection with 17 rendering the assistance $[\tau]$ is responsible for paying the costs of 18 the test. The hospital shall provide the test results to the 19 department or to the local health authority, which are responsible 20 21 for following the procedures prescribed by Section 81.050(h) to 22 inform the person exposed and, if applicable, the patient regarding the test results. The hospital shall follow applicable reporting 23 requirements prescribed by Subchapter C. This subsection does not 24

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- 1 impose a duty on a hospital to provide any further testing,
- 2 treatment, or services or to perform further procedures.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
