	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to participation in school district services and
3	activities by home-schooled students.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 25.006 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 25.006. PART-TIME ENROLLMENT OF HOME-SCHOOLED
8	STUDENT. (a) A home-schooled child entitled under Section 25.001
9	to attend public school in a school district may enroll in public
10	school in the district as a part-time student if the district and
11	the child's parent or guardian agree in writing to the child's
12	enrollment.
13	(b) A student enrolled under this section may participate in
14	an academic class on the same basis as a regularly enrolled student.
15	(c) A school district may not charge a student enrolled
16	under this section tuition but shall charge the student all
17	applicable fees charged a regularly enrolled student.
18	SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
19	amended by adding Sections 29.908 and 29.909 to read as follows:
20	Sec. 29.908. USE OF SCHOOL FACILITY FOR HOME-SCHOOLED
21	STUDENTS. (a) A school district may establish a laboratory or other
22	facility for home-schooled students that is not located on a
23	regular school campus.
24	(b) A school district may permit a home-schooled student

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1	entitled under Section 25.001 to attend public school in the
2	district to use:
3	(1) a laboratory or other facility established under
4	Subsection (a); or
5	(2) a laboratory or other facility located on a
6	regular school campus.
7	(c) A school district may not charge a home-schooled student
8	tuition for use of a laboratory or other facility under this section
9	but shall charge the student a fee comparable to any fee charged a
10	regularly enrolled student for use of a similar facility.
11	(d) A school district may permit a regularly enrolled
12	student to use a laboratory or other facility established under
13	Subsection (a).
14	Sec. 29.909. ON-LINE COURSE FOR HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS.
15	(a) A school district may offer an on-line course to home-schooled
16	students for academic credit.
17	(b) A school district may permit a home-schooled student
18	entitled under Section 25.001 to attend public school in the
19	district to participate in an on-line course offered under
20	Subsection (a).
21	(c) A school district may not charge a home-schooled student
22	tuition for participating in a course offered under Subsection (a)
23	but shall charge the student a fee comparable to any fee charged a
24	regularly enrolled student for participating in the course.
25	(d) A school district may permit a regularly enrolled
26	student to participate in an on-line course offered under
27	Subsection (a).

S.B. No. 412 SECTION 3. Section 31.001, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

3 Sec. 31.001. FREE TEXTBOOKS. <u>(a)</u> Textbooks selected for 4 use in the public schools shall be furnished without cost to the 5 students attending those schools.

6 (b) A school district may furnish textbooks without cost to 7 a home-schooled student who is entitled under Section 25.001 to 8 attend public school in the district. This chapter applies to 9 textbooks furnished to home-schooled students under this 10 subsection in the same manner as it applies to textbooks furnished 11 to students attending public schools.

12 SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is 13 amended by adding Sections 33.087 and 33.088 to read as follows:

14 Sec. 33.087. PARTICIPATION IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 15 BY HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS. (a) A school district may permit a home-schooled student entitled under Section 25.001 to attend 16 public school in the district to participate in a 17 district-sponsored extracurricular activity. If the district 18 19 charges regularly enrolled students a fee for participating in an extracurricular activity, the district shall charge a 20 21 home-schooled student participating in that activity the same fee.

(b) Each home-schooled student entitled under Section 23 25.001 to attend public school is entitled to participate in an 24 extracurricular activity sponsored by the University 25 Interscholastic League on behalf of the school district the student 26 is entitled to attend under Section 25.001(b) if the board of 27 trustees of that district adopts a policy authorizing home-schooled

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1	students to participate in league-sponsored activities.
2	(c) Except as provided by Section 33.088, Subsection (b)
3	does not exempt a home-schooled student from satisfying, as
4	provided by league rule, each eligibility requirement for
5	participating in a league-sponsored activity other than class
6	attendance requirements.
7	Sec. 33.088. APPLICATION OF ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS TO
8	HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN EXTRACURRICULAR
9	ACTIVITIES. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), Sections
10	33.081(c)-(g) do not apply to a home-schooled student participating
11	in an extracurricular activity sponsored by a school district or
12	the University Interscholastic League as provided by Section
13	33.087.
14	(b) A home-schooled student participating in
15	extracurricular activities is subject to Sections 33.081(c)-(g) if
16	the student was a regularly enrolled student in a school district
17	and withdrew from school in the district and became a home-schooled
18	student:
19	(1) while the student was subject to a suspension
20	under Section 33.081(c); or
21	(2) during the last week of a grade evaluation period.
22	(c) For the grade evaluation period that follows the grade
23	evaluation period during which a home-schooled student to whom
24	Subsection (b) applies withdrew from public school, the student's
25	instructor must provide to the principal of the school to which the
26	student is assigned for participation in extracurricular
27	activities, at the time grades must be reported for students

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1	enrolled in the school, an affidavit affirming that the student:
2	(1) is taking a number of grade-level courses
3	equivalent to the academic requirements for a full-time student at
4	the student's grade level enrolled in the school; and
5	(2) has grades for that reporting period that satisfy
6	grade requirements under Section 33.081(c) for participation in
7	extracurricular activities.
8	(d) In this section, "grade evaluation period" has the
9	meaning assigned by Section 33.081(c).
10	SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
11	amended by adding Section 39.034 to read as follows:
12	Sec. 39.034. ASSESSMENT OF HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENT
13	PROHIBITED. A school district may not administer an assessment
14	instrument under this chapter to a home-schooled student included
15	in the district's average daily attendance under Section 42.0051.
16	SECTION 6. Subchapter A, Chapter 42, Education Code, is
17	amended by adding Section 42.0051 to read as follows:
18	Sec. 42.0051. INCLUSION OF HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS IN
19	AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE. (a) The average daily attendance of a
20	school district includes each home-schooled student:
21	(1) who is entitled under Section 25.001 to attend
22	public school in the district; and
23	(2) who:
24	(A) attends a district school as a part-time
25	student as provided by Section 25.006;
26	(B) participates in an on-line course offered by
27	the district under Section 29.909;

1 (C) uses an off-campus laboratory or other 2 facility established by the district for home-schooled students as provided by Section 29.908; 3 4 (D) receives textbooks from the district as 5 provided by Section 31.001(b); or 6 (E) participates in an extracurricular activity 7 sponsored or sanctioned by the school district or the University 8 Interscholastic League as a representative of a district school as 9 provided by Section 33.087. (b) For each day of the minimum school year under Section 10 25.081(a) that a home-schooled student receives services or 11 12 textbooks or participates in a course or an extracurricular activity as described by Subsection (a)(2), the school district is 13 14 entitled to include the student as a full-time student in the 15 district's attendance for that day. SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004 16 17 school year. SECTION 8. Except as provided by Subsection (b) of (a) 18 this section, this Act takes effect immediately if it receives a 19 vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 23 24 (b) Section 6 of this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
