10	compensation, and includes transportation by a bus service.
11	(b) A person commits an offense if, within the boundaries of
12	an airport operated by a home-rule municipality, the person:
13	(1) solicits ground transportation business without
14	the permission of the municipality, if required; or
15	(2) engages in ground transportation business without
16	the permission of the municipality, if required.
17	(c) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor.
18	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 22, Transportation Code,
19	is amended by adding Section 22.0815 to read as follows:
20	Sec. 22.0815. (a) In this section, "ground transportation
21	business" means the transportation by motor vehicle of persons or
22	baggage for compensation.
23	(b) A person commits an offense if, within the boundaries of
24	an airport operated or controlled by a joint board for which the

1	constituent agencies are populous home-rule municipalities, the
2	person:
3	(1) solicits ground transportation business without
4	the permission of the joint board, if required; or
5	(2) engages in ground transportation business without
6	the permission of the joint board, if required.
7	(c) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor.
8	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
