- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 56.202, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 56.202. PURPOSE. (a) The Early High School
- 9 Graduation Scholarship program is created to increase efficiency in
- 10 the Foundation School Program and to provide [tuition] assistance
- 11 for tuition and mandatory fees to an eligible person to enable that
- 12 person to attend a Texas public or private institution of higher
- 13 education.
- 14 (b) A portion of the savings to the Foundation School
- 15 Program that occur as a result of the program is dedicated to state
- 16 [tuition] credits for tuition and mandatory fees provided to an
- 17 eligible person under [by] the program.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 56.203, Education Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 56.203. ELIGIBLE PERSON. (a) To be eligible for the
- 21 Early High School Graduation Scholarship program, a person must:
- (1) have the written approval of at least one of the
- 23 person's parents or a person standing in parental relation to the
- 24 person, if the person graduated from high school in not more than 41

consecutive months;

- 2 (2) have successfully completed the requirements for a
- 3 public high school diploma [in not more than 36 consecutive months]
- 4 and graduated [or be eligible for graduation] from a Texas public
- 5 high school in not more than 41 consecutive months or, if the person
- 6 graduated with at least 30 hours of college credit, in not more than
- 7 45 consecutive months;
- 8 (3) have attended high school in this state only; and
- 9 (4) be a Texas resident as defined by Texas Higher
- 10 Education Coordinating Board rule.
- 11 (b) A person's eligibility for the Early High School
- 12 Graduation Scholarship program ends on the sixth anniversary of the
- date that the person first becomes eligible to participate in the
- 14 program, unless the person is provided additional time to
- participate in the program under Subsection (c).
- 16 (c) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to provide a
- 17 person who is otherwise eligible to participate in the Early High
- 18 School Graduation Scholarship program additional time to use a
- 19 state credit for tuition and mandatory fees under the program. The
- 20 rules must require a person seeking an extension under this
- 21 <u>subsection to show hardship or other good cause that prevents the</u>
- 22 person from enrolling in or continuing enrollment in an eligible
- 23 <u>institution during the period provided by Subsection (b).</u> For
- 24 purposes of this subsection, hardship or other good cause includes
- 25 a severe illness or other debilitating condition or responsibility
- 26 for the care of a sick, injured, or needy person.
- SECTION 3. Section 56.204, Education Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 56.204. ENTITLEMENT; MATCHING CREDIT. (a) An
- 3 eligible person under the Early High School Graduation Scholarship
- 4 program is entitled to \underline{a} [\$1,000 in] state \underline{credit} to pay tuition \underline{and}
- 5 mandatory fees [credits] at a [Texas] public or private institution
- of higher education in this state in the following amounts:
- 7 (1) \$2,000 if the person successfully completed the
- 8 requirements for a public high school diploma and graduated from
- 9 high school in 36 consecutive months or less and an additional
- 10 \$1,000 if the person graduated with at least 15 hours of college
- 11 credit;
- 12 (2) \$500 if the person successfully completed the
- 13 requirements for a public high school diploma and graduated from
- 14 high school in more than 36 consecutive months but not more than 41
- consecutive months and an additional \$1,000 if the person graduated
- with at least 30 hours of college credit; or
- 17 (3) \$1,000 if the person successfully completed the
- 18 requirements for a public high school diploma and graduated from
- 19 high school in more than 41 consecutive months but not more than 45
- 20 consecutive months with at least 30 hours of college credit.
- 21 (b) The use of a credit at a [Texas] private institution is
- 22 contingent on a private institution's agreement to match the state
- 23 [tuition] credit.
- 24 (c) A person eligible for a tuition credit under the tuition
- 25 credit program authorized by Rider 23, page III-9, Chapter 19, Acts
- of the 72nd Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1991 (the General
- 27 Appropriations Act), who did not receive a credit under that

- 1 program is eligible for and entitled to \$1,000 in state tuition
- 2 credits under this subchapter. This subsection expires September
- 3 1, 2005.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 56.205, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 56.205. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE. The coordinating
- 7 board shall provide a certificate for state [tuition] credits for
- 8 <u>tuition and mandatory fees</u> to an eligible person.
- 9 SECTION 5. Section 56.206, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 56.206. USE OF STATE [TUITION] CREDIT. (a) On
- 12 enrollment of an eligible person in an eligible institution of
- 13 higher education, the institution shall apply to the person's
- 14 [tuition] charges for tuition and mandatory fees for the enrollment
- period an amount equal to the lesser of:
- 16 (1) the amount of the state [tuition] credit available
- 17 to the person; or
- 18 (2) the person's actual tuition and mandatory fees.
- 19 (b) A private institution of higher education shall apply
- 20 the state [tuition] credit and the matching credit required by
- 21 Section 56.204(b) in equal amounts.
- (c) For each student using a state [tuition] credit for
- 23 <u>tuition and mandatory fees</u> under this subchapter, the institution
- of higher education shall report to the coordinating board:
- 25 (1) the student's name;
- 26 (2) the school district from which the student
- 27 graduated from high school; and

- 1 (3) the amount of the state [tuition] credit applied.
- 2 (d) Subject to Section 56.203(b), an eligible person may use
- 3 the state credit for enrollment in an eligible institution of
- 4 higher education during any semester or summer session, except the
- 5 person's initial use of the credit may not be for enrollment during
- 6 any term of a summer session immediately following the person's
- 7 graduation from high school.
- 8 SECTION 6. The heading to Section 56.207, Education Code,
- 9 is amended to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 56.207. PAYMENT OF STATE [TUITION] CREDIT.
- 11 SECTION 7. Sections 56.207(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) At least once each year the coordinating board shall
- 14 submit a report to the commissioner of education that includes:
- 15 (1) the name of each student who used the state
- 16 [tuition] credit under this subchapter during the period covered by
- 17 the report;
- 18 (2) the school district from which each student
- 19 graduated from high school; and
- 20 (3) the amount of the state [tuition] credit used by
- 21 each student during the period covered by the report.
- (b) On receipt of a report from the coordinating board under
- 23 Subsection (a), the commissioner shall transfer to the coordinating
- 24 board, from funds appropriated for the Foundation School Program,
- 25 an amount sufficient to pay each eligible institution of higher
- 26 education the amount of state [tuition] credit for tuition and
- 27 mandatory fees that is applied by the institution during the period

- 1 covered by the report.
- 2 SECTION 8. Subchapter K, Chapter 56, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 56.2075 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 56.2075. PAYMENT OF SCHOOL DISTRICT CREDIT. (a) A
- 5 school district is entitled to a one-time credit of:
- 6 (1) \$1,000 for each eligible person graduating from
- 7 high school in the district who uses any part of a state credit of
- 8 \$2,000 or more under Section 56.204(a)(1); and
- 9 (2) \$250 for each eligible person graduating from high
- school in the district who uses any part of a state credit of \$500 or
- 11 more under Section 56.204(a)(2).
- 12 (b) The commissioner shall distribute money from the
- 13 foundation school fund in an amount sufficient to pay each school
- 14 district under Subsection (a).
- SECTION 9. Section 54.213(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (b) Savings to the foundation school fund that occur as a
- 18 result of the Early High School Graduation Scholarship program
- 19 created in Subchapter K, Chapter 56, and that are not required for
- 20 the funding of state [tuition] credits for tuition and mandatory
- 21 <u>fees</u> under <u>Section 56.204</u> or school district credits under <u>Section</u>
- 22 56.2075 [that program] shall be used first to provide tuition
- 23 exemptions under Section 54.212. Any of those savings remaining
- 24 after providing tuition exemptions under Section 54.212 shall be
- used to provide tuition exemptions under Section 54.214. The Texas
- 26 Education Agency shall also accept and make available to provide
- 27 tuition exemptions under Section 54.214 gifts, grants, and

- 1 donations made to the agency for that purpose. Payment of funds
- 2 under this subsection shall be made in the manner provided by
- 3 Section 56.207 for state [tuition] credits under Subchapter K,
- 4 Chapter 56.
- 5 SECTION 10. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 6 only to a student who graduates from a public high school on or
- 7 after the effective date of this Act. A student who graduates from
- 8 a public high school before the effective date of this Act and the
- 9 amount and treatment of tuition credit for that student is governed
- 10 by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this
- 11 Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 (b) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
