4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 8, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
6	Chapter 1305 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 1305. ELECTRICIANS
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 1305.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as
10	the Texas Electrical Safety and Licensing Act.
11	Sec. 1305.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
12	(1) "Board" means the Texas Electrical Licensing

- (2) "Electrical code" means the National Electrical 14
- Code published by the National Fire Protection Association as 15
- adopted by the board. 16
- 17 (3) "Electrical contracting" means the business of
- 18 designing, installing, erecting, repairing, or altering electrical
- 19 wires or conductors to be used for light, heat, power, or signaling
- purposes. The term includes the installation or repair of ducts, 20
- 21 raceways, or conduits for the reception or protection of wires or
- conductors and the installation or repair of any electrical 22
- 23 machinery, apparatus, or system used for electrical light, heat,
- 24 power, or signaling.

- 1 (4) "Electrical contractor" means a person engaged in
- 2 electrical contracting.
- 3 (5) "Electrical engineer" means a person licensed
- 4 under Chapter 1001 who possesses the necessary qualifications,
- 5 training, and technical knowledge to perform electrical
- 6 engineering work in this state.
- 7 (6) "Electrical inspector" means a person certified by
- 8 the International Association of Electrical Inspectors.
- 9 "Electrical work" means any labor or material used
- 10 in installing, maintaining, or extending an electrical wiring
- 11 system and the appurtenances, apparatus, or equipment used in
- 12 connection with the use of electrical energy in, on, outside, or
- 13 attached to a building, residence, structure, property, or
- 14 premises. The term includes service entrance conductors as defined
- by the National Electrical Code.
- 16 <u>(8) "Residential wireman" means a person licensed</u>
- 17 under this chapter who may only perform electrical installations in
- 18 single-family and multifamily dwellings not exceeding four
- 19 stories.
- 20 (9) "Training director" means a person who is
- 21 responsible for supervising training programs for apprentice
- 22 electricians.
- 23 <u>Sec. 1305.003. EXEMPTIONS; APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. (a)</u>
- 24 This chapter does not apply to:
- 25 (1) the installation of electrical equipment in a
- 26 ship, watercraft other than a floating building, railway rolling
- 27 stock, aircraft, or a motor vehicle other than a mobile home or

2	(2) the installation of electrical equipment
3	underground in a mine and in self-propelled mobile surface mining
4	machinery and its attendant electrical trailing cable;
5	(3) the installation of electrical equipment for
6	generation, transformation, transmission, or distribution of power
7	used exclusively to operate railway rolling stock or exclusively
8	for signaling and communications purposes;
9	(4) the installation of communications equipment
10	under the exclusive control of a communications utility and located
11	outdoors or in a building used exclusively for those installations,
12	provided that the voltage does not exceed 50 volts;
13	(5) the installation of electrical equipment under the
14	exclusive control of an electric utility and used for
15	communications or metering, or for the generation, control,
16	transformation, transmission, and distribution of electric energy,

26	(6) work not specifically regulated by a municipal
27	ordinance that is performed in or on a dwelling by a person who owns

1 and resides in the dwelling; 2 (7) work involved in the manufacture of electrical 3 equipment; 4 (8) electrical maintenance work involving the 5 removal, maintenance, or repair of existing electrical equipment 6 if: 7 (A) the work does not involve the extension, relocation, alteration, or addition of electrical wiring and 8 9 equipment; 10 (B) the work is performed by a person regularly employed as a maintenance person at the building or premises; 11 12 (C) the work is performed in conjunction with the business in which the person is employed; and 13 14 (D) the person does not engage in electrical work 15 for the public; 16 (9) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 17 repair of electrical equipment or associated wiring under the exclusive control of a gas utility and used for communications or 18 metering or for the control, transmission, or distribution of 19 natural gas; and 20 21 (10) thoroughfare lighting controlled by a governmental entity. 22 (b) This chapter applies to all premises wiring that 23 24 originates where an electric utility's facilities end and a 25 nonutility customer's electric facilities begin. 26 (c) This chapter applies to an installation in a building

used by a utility for purposes other than a purpose listed in this

- 2 shop, or recreational building that is not an integral part of a
- 3 generating plant, substation, or control center.
- 4 Sec. 1305.004. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas
- 5 Electrical Licensing Board is subject to Chapter 325, Government
- 6 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
- 7 by that chapter, the board is abolished and this chapter expires
- 8 September 1, 2015.
- 9 [Sections 1305.005-1305.050 reserved for expansion]
- 10 SUBCHAPTER B. TEXAS ELECTRICAL LICENSING BOARD
- 11 Sec. 1305.051. TEXAS ELECTRICAL LICENSING BOARD. (a) The
- 12 Texas Electrical Licensing Board consists of nine members appointed
- 13 by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate as
- 14 follows:
- 15 <u>(1) one member who is a master electrician and is a</u>
- 16 member of a statewide association of electrical contractors not
- 17 affiliated with a labor organization;
- 18 (2) one member who is a master electrician and is a
- 19 member of a statewide association of electrical contractors
- 20 affiliated with a labor organization;
- 21 (3) one member who is a journeyman electrician
- 22 employed by a member of a statewide association of electrical
- 23 <u>contractors not affiliated with a labor organization;</u>
- 24 (4) one member who is a journeyman electrician who is a
- 25 member of a statewide labor organization;
- 26 (5) one member who is a training director affiliated
- 27 with a statewide organization that is not affiliated with a labor

- 1 organization;
- 2 (6) one member who is a training director affiliated
- 3 with a statewide labor organization;
- 4 (7) one member who is a licensed electrical engineer
- 5 selected from a list of names submitted by a statewide association
- 6 of professional engineers;
- 7 (8) one member who is an electrical inspector selected
- 8 from a list of names submitted by a statewide association of
- 9 municipal governments; and
- 10 (9) one member who represents the public.
- 11 (b) In appointing members of the board under Subsections
- (a)(1)-(7), the governor may consider the names of individuals
- 13 submitted by trade associations and labor organizations having
- 14 members who are engaged in the relevant trade or profession.
- 15 (c) An appointment to the board shall be made without regard
- 16 to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or national
- 17 origin of the appointee.
- Sec. 1305.052. PUBLIC MEMBER ELIGIBILITY. A person is not
- 19 eligible for appointment as the public member of the board if the
- 20 person or the person's spouse:
- 21 <u>(1) is registered, certified, or licensed by an</u>
- 22 occupational regulatory agency in the field of electrical
- 23 construction;
- 24 (2) is employed by or participates in the management
- of a business entity or other organization regulated by the board or
- 26 receiving funds from the board;
- 27 (3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more

- 1 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 2 organization regulated by the board or receiving funds from the
- 3 board; or
- 4 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 5 goods, services, or funds from the board, other than compensation
- 6 or reimbursement authorized by law for board membership,
- 7 <u>attendance</u>, or expenses.
- 8 Sec. 1305.053. MEMBERSHIP AND EMPLOYEE RESTRICTION. A
- 9 person may not serve as a member of the board or act as the general
- 10 counsel to the board if the person is required to register as a
- 11 lobbyist under Chapter 305, Government Code, because of the
- 12 person's activities for compensation on behalf of a profession
- 13 related to the operation of the board.
- 14 Sec. 1305.054. REMOVAL OF MEMBERS. (a) The governor may
- 15 remove an appointed board member for inefficiency, abuse, or
- 16 <u>neglect of duty in office. In addition, it is a ground for removal</u>
- from the board that a member:
- 18 (1) does not have at the time of appointment the
- 19 qualifications required by Section 1305.051 for appointment to the
- 20 board;
- 21 (2) does not maintain during service on the board the
- 22 qualifications required by Section 1305.051 for appointment to the
- 23 board;
- 24 (3) is ineligible for membership under Section
- 25 <u>1305.052</u>; or
- 26 (4) violates a prohibition established by Section
- 27 1305.053.

- 1 (b) If the executive director has knowledge that a potential
- 2 ground for removal exists, the executive director shall notify the
- 3 presiding officer of the board of the ground. The presiding officer
- 4 shall then notify the governor that a potential ground for removal
- 5 exists.
- 6 (c) The validity of an action of the board is not affected by
- 7 the fact that it was taken when a ground for removal of a member of
- 8 the board existed.
- 9 Sec. 1305.055. TERMS; VACANCIES. (a) Board members serve
- 10 terms of six years, with the terms of three members expiring on
- 11 February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
- 12 (b) A member may not consecutively serve more than two full
- 13 terms.
- 14 (c) If a vacancy occurs during a term, the governor shall
- appoint a replacement who meets the qualifications of the vacated
- 16 position to serve for the remainder of the term.
- 17 Sec. 1305.056. PRESIDING OFFICER. The board shall elect
- one of its members to serve as presiding officer for a term of one
- 19 year. The presiding officer may vote on any matter before the
- 20 board.
- Sec. 1305.057. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES.
- 22 Board members may not receive compensation but are entitled to
- 23 reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 24 performing the functions of the board, subject to the General
- 25 <u>Appropriations Act.</u>
- Sec. 1305.058. MEETINGS. The board shall meet at least once
- 27 every four months and may meet at other times at the call of the

1 presiding officer or as provided by the rules of the board. 2 [Sections 1305.059-1305.100 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER C. BOARD PERSONNEL 3 4 Sec. 1305.101. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; PERSONNEL. The board shall employ an executive director who may hire the personnel 5 6 necessary to administer the duties of the board. Sec. 1305.102. EMPLOYEE <u>RESTRICTIONS</u>. (a) In this 7 section, "Texas trade association" means a nonprofit, cooperative, 8 9 and voluntarily joined association of business or professional competitors in this state designed to assist its members and its 10 industry or profession in dealing with mutual business or 11 12 professional problems and in promoting their common interest. (b) An officer, employee, or paid consultant of a Texas 13 14 trade association or union in the field of electrical contracting 15 may not be an employee of the board who is exempt from the state's position classification plan or is compensated at or above the 16 17 amount prescribed by the General Appropriations Act for step 1, salary group A17, of the position classification salary schedule. 18 (c) A person who is the spouse of an officer, employee, or 19 paid consultant of a Texas trade association or union in the field 20 21 of electrical contracting may not be a board employee who is exempt from the state's position classification plan or is compensated at 22 or above the amount prescribed by the General Appropriations Act 23 24 for step 1, salary group A17, of the position classification salary 25 schedule.

The board shall provide to its members and employees as often as is

- 10 (2) after publication of the National Electrical Code
- 11 by the National Fire Protection Association every three years,
- 12 adopt the revised National Electrical Code as the electrical code
- for the state, as amended by the board;

3	Sec. 1305.201. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION. (a) The board
4	shall prepare information of public interest describing the
5	functions of the board and the procedures by which complaints are
6	filed with and resolved by the board.
7	(b) The board shall make the information available to the
8	public and appropriate state agencies.
9	Sec. 1305.202. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. The board shall
10	develop and implement policies that provide the public with a
11	reasonable opportunity to appear before the board and to speak on
12	any issue under the jurisdiction of the board.
13	Sec. 1305.203. COMPLAINTS. The board by rule shall
14	establish methods by which consumers and service recipients are
15	notified of the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the

27	electrical work unless the person holds an appropriate license

- 2 Sec. 1305.252. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS. An applicant for
- 3 a license under this chapter must:
- 4 (1) submit to the board a completed application on a
- 5 form prescribed by the board;
- 6 (2) submit to the board any other information required

- 8 (3) demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board the

- 27 (1) have at least 8,000 hours of on-the-job training

- 1 under the supervision of a master or journeyman electrician; and
- 2 (2) pass a journeyman electrician examination
- 3 administered under this chapter.
- 4 Sec. 1305.256. JOURNEYMAN SIGN ELECTRICIAN. An applicant
- 5 for a license as a journeyman sign electrician must:
- 6 (1) have at least 8,000 hours of on-the-job training
- 7 under the supervision of a master or journeyman sign electrician;
- 8 and
- 9 (2) pass a journeyman sign electrician examination
- 10 <u>administered under this chapter.</u>
- 11 Sec. 1305.257. RESIDENTIAL WIREMAN. An applicant for a
- 12 license as a residential wireman must:
- 13 (1) have at least 4,000 hours of on-the-job training
- 14 under the supervision of a master or journeyman electrician or

- 16 (2) pass a residential wireman examination

- 18 Sec. 1305.258. MAINTENANCE ELECTRICIAN. An applicant for a
- 19 license as a maintenance electrician must:
- 20 (1) have at least 8,000 hours of on-the-job training
- 21 under the supervision of a master or journeyman electrician or
- 22 maintenance electrician; and
- 23 <u>(2) pass a maintenance electrician examination</u>
- 24 administered under this chapter.
- Sec. 1305.259. ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR. (a) An applicant
- 26 for a license as an electrical contractor must:
- 27 (1) be licensed under this chapter as a master

- 1 electrician or employ a person licensed under this chapter as a
- 2 master electrician;
- 3 (2) establish proof of financial responsibility in the
- 4 manner prescribed by the board; and
- 5 (3) maintain workers' compensation coverage for the
- 6 contractor's employees as prescribed by the Labor Code.
- 7 <u>(b) A person who holds a master electrician license issued</u>
- 8 or recognized by this chapter may only be assigned to a single
- 9 <u>electrical contractor</u>, unless the master electrician owns more than
- 10 <u>50 percent of the electrical contracting business.</u>
- Sec. 1305.260. ELECTRICAL SIGN CONTRACTOR. (a) An
- 12 applicant for a license as an electrical sign contractor must:
- 13 (1) be licensed under this chapter as a master sign
- 14 electrician or employ a person licensed under this chapter as a
- 15 master sign electrician;
- 16 (2) establish proof of financial responsibility in the
- manner prescribed by the board; and
- 18 (3) maintain workers' compensation coverage for the
- 19 contractor's employees as prescribed by the Labor Code.
- 20 (b) A person who holds a master sign electrician license
- 21 <u>issued or recognized by this chapter may only be assigned to a</u>
- 22 single electrical contractor, unless the master sign electrician
- 23 owns more than 50 percent of the electrical sign contracting
- 24 business.
- Sec. 1305.261. ELECTRICAL APPRENTICE. An applicant for a
- license as an electrical apprentice must be at least 16 years of age
- 27 and be engaged in the process of learning and assisting in the

- 1 installation of electrical work under the supervision of a licensed
- 2 master or journeyman electrician.
- 3 Sec. 1305.262. EXAMINATIONS. (a) Examinations required by
- 4 this subchapter shall be conducted at least once each month
- 5 throughout the state in regional locations designated by the board.
- 6 (b) The board shall prescribe the content of each written
- 7 <u>examination</u>, which must test the knowledge of the applicant about
- 8 materials and methods used in electrical installations and the
- 9 standards prescribed by the National Electrical Code as adopted by
- 10 the board.
- 11 (c) The board shall determine uniform standards for
- 12 acceptable performance on an examination.
- (d) An applicant who does not pass the examination may not
- 14 retake the examination before the 90th day after the date of the
- 15 <u>failed examination</u>.
- 16 (e) The board may contract with a national testing service
- 17 to administer examinations.
- Sec. 1305.263. EXAMINATION RESULTS. (a) Not later than the
- 19 30th day after the date on which an examination is administered
- 20 under this chapter, the board shall notify each examinee of the
- 21 <u>results of the examination. If an examination is graded or reviewed</u>
- 22 by a national testing service, the board shall notify examinees of
- 23 the result of the examination not later than the 14th day after the
- 24 date on which the board receives the results from the testing
- 25 service.
- 26 (b) If the notice of the examination results will be delayed
- 27 for more than 60 days after the examination date, the board shall

- 1 notify each examinee of the reason for the delay before the 60th
- 2 day.
- 3 <u>(c) If requested in writing by a person who fails an</u>
- 4 examination administered under this chapter, the board shall
- 5 provide to the person an analysis of the person's performance on the
- 6 examination.
- 7 Sec. 1305.264. NONRESIDENT LICENSE APPLICANT. The board
- 8 may issue a license under this chapter to an applicant who holds a
- 9 license in another state and who submits a proper application and
- 10 pays the required fees if the board determines that the applicant is
- 11 licensed in a state with which there is an agreement to recognize
- 12 licenses issued under this chapter.
- Sec. 1305.265. LICENSE ISSUANCE; NONTRANSFERABILITY. (a)
- 14 Not later than the 30th day after the date on which the board
- 15 determines that an applicant has passed the examination required
- 16 <u>under this chapter, the board shall issue a license to the applicant</u>
- if the applicant has complied with the application requirements and
- 18 paid the fees required by this chapter.
- 19 (b) A license issued by the board is valid throughout this
- 20 state and is not transferable.
- 21 Sec. 1305.266. DISPLAY OF LICENSE. (a) An electrical
- 22 <u>contractor</u> and electrical sign contractor shall display the
- 23 contractor's business name and the number of the license issued by
- the board on each vehicle owned by the contractor.
- 25 (b) The information required to be displayed must be:
- 26 (1) printed in letters and numbers that are at least
- 27 two inches high and in a color that contrasts with the color of the

- background surface; and
- 2 (2) permanently affixed in conspicuous places on both
- 3 sides of the vehicle.
- 4 Sec. 1305.267. LICENSE RENEWAL. (a) Except as provided by
- 5 Subsection (b), a license expires on December 31 of the third year
- 6 after issuance and may be renewed every three years on payment of
- 7 the required renewal fee.
- 8 (b) The board by rule may adopt a system under which
- 9 licenses expire on various dates during the year. For the year in
- 10 which the license expiration date is changed, renewal fees payable
- on or before December 31 shall be prorated on a monthly basis so
- that each license holder pays only that portion of the renewal fee
- that is applicable to the number of months during which the license
- 14 is valid. On renewal of the license on the new expiration date, the
- 15 total renewal fee is due.
- 16 (c) Not later than the 30th day preceding the expiration
- 17 date of a person's license, the board shall notify the person in
- 18 writing, at the person's last known mailing address, of the
- 19 impending license expiration. A person may renew an unexpired
- 20 license by paying to the board, before the license expiration date,
- 21 the required renewal fee.
- 22 (d) A person whose license has been expired for 90 days or
- 23 less may renew the license by paying to the board the required
- 24 renewal fee and a late fee in an amount equal to half of the
- 25 examination fee for the license. A person whose license has been
- 26 expired for more than 90 days but less than two years may renew the
- 27 license by paying to the board all unpaid renewal fees and a late

- 1 fee in an amount equal to the examination fee for the license. A
- 2 person whose license has been expired for more than two years may
- 3 not renew the license. The person may obtain a new license by
- 4 submitting to reexamination and complying with the requirements and
- 5 procedures for obtaining an original license.
- 6 Sec. 1305.268. CONTINUING EDUCATION. To renew a master
- 7 electrician, journeyman electrician, master sign electrician,

- SUBCHAPTER G. REGULATION OF ELECTRICIANS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS
- 13 Sec. 1305.301. MUNICIPAL OR REGIONAL REGULATION. (a) This
- 14 chapter does not prohibit a municipality or region from regulating
- 15 electricians by:
- 16 (1) enacting an ordinance requiring inspections;
- 17 (2) offering examinations;
- 18 <u>(3) issuing municipal or regional licenses; or</u>
- 19 (4) collecting permit fees for municipal or regional
- 20 <u>licenses and examinations from electricians for work performed in</u>
- 21 <u>the municipality or region.</u>
- (b) A municipality or region may not require a person to
- 23 take a municipal or regional examination if that person holds the
- 24 appropriate license issued under this chapter and is working within
- 25 the scope of that license.
- 26 (c) Electrical work must be installed in accordance with all
- 27 applicable local ordinances or in accordance with standards at

- 1 least as stringent as those contained in the state electrical code
- 2 adopted by the board.
- 3 Sec. 1305.302. SCOPE OF MUNICIPAL OR REGIONAL LICENSE. A
- 4 license to perform electrical work issued by a municipality or
- 5 region is valid only in the municipality or region or in another
- 6 municipality or region under a reciprocal agreement.
