A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to mentor-protege programs used by certain state agencies 3 for historically underutilized businesses. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 2161.065, Government Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: Sec. 2161.065. MENTOR-PROTEGE 7 PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall design a mentor-protege program to foster 8 9 long-term relationships between mentors [prime contractors] and historically underutilized businesses to provide professional 10 11 guidance and support to the businesses to facilitate their 12 development and growth and to increase their [the] ability [of 13 historically underutilized businesses] to contract with the state 14 or to receive subcontracts under a state contract. Each state agency with a biennial appropriation that exceeds \$10 million shall 15 implement the program designed by the commission. 16 (b) Participation in the program must be voluntary for both 17 18 the <u>mentor</u> [contractor] and the historically underutilized business [subcontractor]. 19 (c) The commission may not require a mentor under the 20 21 mentor-protege program to be a registered bidder on the commission's centralized master bidders list. 22 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
