4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 451.108, Transportation Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	Sec. 451.108. PEACE OFFICERS. (a) An authority may
8	commission and employ peace officers.
9	(b) An authority created before 1980 in which the principal
10	municipality has a population of less than 1.2 million may
11	establish a security force, employ security personnel, and
12	commission security personnel as peace officers.
13	(c) A peace officer commissioned under this section, except
14	as provided by <u>Subsections (d) and (e)</u> [Subsection (c)], may:
15	(1) make an arrest in any county in which the transit
16	authority system is located as necessary to prevent or abate the
17	commission of an offense against the law of this state or a
18	political subdivision of this state if the offense or threatened
19	offense occurs on or involves the transit authority system;
20	(2) make an arrest for an offense involving injury or
21	detriment to the transit authority system;
22	(3) enforce traffic laws and investigate traffic
23	accidents that involve or occur in the transit authority system;

1 (4) provide emergency and public safety services to the transit authority system or users of the transit authority 2 3 system.

(d) [(c)] A peace officer who holds a commission under this 4 5 section from an authority in which the principal municipality has a population of more than 1.5 million and who has filed with the 6 7 authority the oath of a peace officer has all the powers, privileges, and immunities of peace officers in the counties in 8 9 which the transit authority system is located, provides services, or is supported by a general sales and use tax. 10

(e) A peace officer who holds a commission under this 11 section from an authority created before 1980 in which the 12 principal municipality has a population of less than 1.2 million 13 and who has filed with the authority the oath of a peace officer has 14 all the powers, privileges, and immunities of peace officers in the 15 16 counties in which the transit authority system is located, provides services, or is supported by a general sales and use tax while the 17 18 peace officer is on the transit authority system property or performing duties in connection with the transit authority system 19 20 or its users. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
