7	(a) The department, in accordance with 8 U.S.C. Section 1182(e),
8	as amended, under exceptions provided by 8 U.S.C. Section 1184(1),
9	as amended, may request waiver of the foreign country residence
10	requirement for a qualified alien physician who agrees to practice
11	medicine in a medically underserved area or health professional
12	shortage area, as designated by the United States Department of
13	Health and Human Services, that has a current shortage of
14	physicians.
15	(b) The department may charge a fee to cover the costs
16	incurred by the department in administering the visa waiver program
17	established under this section.
18	SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 155.1025, Occupations
19	Code, is amended to read as follows:
20	(a) The board shall adopt rules for expediting any
21	application for a license under this subtitle made by a person who
22	is licensed to practice medicine in another state or country and who
23	submits an affidavit with the application stating that:
24	(1) the applicant intends to practice in a rural

No. 558 community, as determined by the Office of Rural Community Affairs 1 2 [Center for Rural Health Initiatives]; or 3 (2) the applicant: (A) has requested and is eligible for an 4 immigration visa waiver as described by Section 12.0127, Health and 5 Safety Code; and 6 7 intends to practice medicine [+ (B) [(A) accept employment with an entity located] in 8 9 a medically underserved area or health professional shortage area, 10 designated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, that has a current shortage of physicians [and affiliated 11 with or participating in a public university-sponsored graduate 12 13 medical education program; [(B) serve on the faculty of the public 14 15 university-sponsored graduate medical education program; and 16 [(C) engage in the practice of medicine and 17 teaching in a specialty field of medicine that is necessary to maintain the accreditation of the 18 ohtain university-sponsored graduate medical education program by the 19 Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education]. 20 SECTION 3. Section 51.949, Education Code, as added by 21 22 Chapter 1293, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is repealed. 23 24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
