## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to awards granted under the Texas Advanced Placement
- 3 Incentive Program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.053, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 28.053. TYPES OF AWARDS. (a) A school participating
- 8 in the program may be awarded:
- 9 (1) a one-time \$3,000 equipment grant for providing a
- 10 college advanced placement course or international baccalaureate
- 11 course to be paid to a school based on need as determined by the
- 12 commissioner; and
- 13 (2) \$100 for each student who scores a three or better
- 14 on a college advanced placement test or four or better on an
- international baccalaureate examination.
- 16 (b) Funds awarded under Subsection (a) shall be used in the
- 17 manner determined by the campus team established under Subsection
- 18 (c).
- 19 (c) The principal of each school participating in the
- 20 program shall convene, at least annually, a team of no fewer than
- 21 three teachers, to include at least one teacher participating in
- 22 the program and at least one teacher who teaches students in
- 23 preparation for their participation in the program, for the purpose
- 24 of determining the use of funds awarded under Subsection (a).

- 1 Nothing in this section limits the authority of the team to direct
- 2 expenditure of funds awarded under Subsection (a)(2) for awards to
- 3 individual teachers participating in the program.
- 4 (d) A teacher participating in the program may be awarded:
- 5 (1) subsidized teacher training, not to exceed \$450
- 6 for each teacher, for a college advanced placement course or  $\underline{an}$
- 7 international baccalaureate course;
- 8 (2) a one-time award of \$250 for teaching a college
- 9 advanced placement course or an international baccalaureate course
- 10 for the first time; and
- 11 (3) a share of the teacher bonus pool, which shall be
- 12 distributed by the teacher's school in shares proportional to the
- 13 number of courses taught.
- (e) [<del>(c)</del>] To be eligible for an award under Subsection
- (d)[<del>(b)</del>], a teacher must teach a college advanced placement course
- or an international baccalaureate course.
- (f)  $[\frac{d}{d}]$  Fifty dollars may be deposited in the teacher
- 18 bonus pool for each student enrolled in the school that scores a
- 19 three or better on a college advanced placement test or four or
- 20 better on an international baccalaureate examination.
- 21 (g) [<del>(e)</del>] A student receiving a score of three or better on
- 22 a college advanced placement test or four or better on an
- 23 international baccalaureate examination may receive reimbursement,
- 24 not to exceed \$65, for the testing fee. The reimbursement shall be
- 25 reduced by the amount of any subsidy awarded by the college board or
- 26 the International Baccalaureate Organization or under Section
- 27 28.054.

- (h) [(f)] The commissioner may enter into agreements with the college board and the International Baccalaureate Organization to pay for all examinations taken by eligible public school students. An eligible student is one who takes a college advanced placement or international baccalaureate course at a public school or who is recommended by the student's principal or teacher to take the test.
- 8 <u>(i)</u> [<del>(g)</del>] The commissioner shall analyze and adjust, as 9 needed, the sum of and number of awards to ensure that the purpose of the program is realized.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
