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- 2 relating to the purposes of the Texas School for the Blind and
- 3 Visually Impaired and the Texas School for the Deaf.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsections (a) and (c), Section 30.021,
- 6 Education Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired is
- 8 a state agency established to serve as a special school in the
- 9 continuum of statewide [alternative] placements for students who
- 10 are 21 years of age or younger on September 1 of any school year and
- 11 who have a visual impairment and who may have one or more other
- 12 disabilities. The school shall provide comprehensive educational
- 13 services to [is intended to serve] students who require specialized
- or intensive educational or related services related to the visual
- impairment. The school is not intended to serve:
- 16 (1) students whose needs are appropriately addressed
- 17 in a home or hospital setting or in a residential treatment
- 18 facility; or
- 19 (2) students whose primary, ongoing needs are related
- 20 to a severe or profound emotional, behavioral, or cognitive
- 21 deficit.
- 22 (c) The school shall provide short-term [conduct
- 23 supplemental] programs, such as summer programs [and student
- 24 <u>exchange programs</u>], to:

- (1) enable students who have a visual impairment to 1 develop skills so that they can benefit from educational programs 2 3 offered by the school districts in which the students reside; and (2) prepare students who have a visual impairment for 4 independent functioning as adults [and shall consider information 5 from sources throughout the state regarding the nature of those 6 7 programs and students to be served]. SECTION 2. Section 30.051, Education Code, is amended to 8 9 read as follows: Sec. 30.051. PURPOSE OF TEXAS SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF. (a) 10 Texas School for the Deaf is a state agency established to <u>serve as</u> 11 a special school in the continuum of statewide placements for 12 students [provide educational services to persons] who are 21 years 13
- 17 (1) the school shall provide comprehensive educational services, on a day or residential basis;

- 9 (b) The school shall serve as a primary statewide resource 10 center promoting excellence in education for students who are deaf 11 or hard of hearing through research, training, and demonstration 12 projects by providing services such as:
- (1) developing and providing local, regional, and

 statewide training for parents of students who are deaf or hard of

 hearing and professionals who work with students who are deaf or

 hard of hearing;
- 17 (2) providing consultation and technical assistance
 18 to parents and professionals related to special education and
 19 related services for students;
- 20 <u>(3)</u> supporting the needs of students, parents, and 21 families through videoconferencing and distance learning;
- (4) developing and disseminating reference materials,
 including materials in the areas of curriculum, instructional
 methodology, and educational technology;
- (5) providing information related to library
 resources, adapted materials, current research, and technology
 resources, and the teaching, assessment, and transition of students

- who are deaf or hard of hearing;
- 2 (6) operating programs for lending educational and
- 3 technological materials to school districts, regional education
- 4 <u>service centers</u>, and parents; and

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- 5 (7) facilitating the preparation of teachers for students who are deaf or hard of hearing.
 - (c) [The school shall work in partnership with state, regional, and local agencies to provide new or improved programs or methods to serve the previously unmet or future needs of persons throughout the state who are deaf or hard of hearing.
 - [(d)] The school shall cooperate with public and private agencies and organizations serving students and other persons who are deaf or <u>hard of</u> hearing [impaired] in the planning, development, and implementation of effective educational and rehabilitative service delivery systems associated with educating students who are deaf or hard of hearing. To maximize and make efficient use of state facilities, funding, and resources, the services provided in this area may include conducting a cooperative program with other agencies to serve persons who have graduated from high school and who have identified needs related to vocational training, independent living skills, [and] social and leisure skills, compensatory skills, or remedial academic skills.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004 24 school year.
- 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
