A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the purposes of the Texas School for the Blind and
- 3 Visually Impaired and the Texas School for the Deaf.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 30.021, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (g) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) The Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired is
- 9 a state agency established to serve as a special school in the
- 10 continuum of statewide [alternative] placements for students who
- 11 are 21 years of age or younger on September 1 of any school year and
- 12 who have a visual impairment and who may have one or more other
- 13 disabilities. The school shall provide comprehensive educational
- 14 services to [is intended to serve] students who require specialized
- or intensive educational or related services related to the visual
- 16 impairment. The school may [is] not [intended to] serve:
- 17 (1) students whose needs are appropriately addressed
- 18 in a home or hospital setting or in a residential treatment
- 19 facility; or
- 20 (2) students whose primary, ongoing needs are related
- 21 to a severe or profound emotional, behavioral, or cognitive
- 22 deficit.
- 23 (c) The school shall provide short-term programs [conduct
- 24 supplemental], including [such as] summer programs [and student

- 1 exchange programs], to:
- 2 (1) enable students who have a visual impairment to
- 3 develop skills so that they can benefit from educational programs
- 4 offered by the school districts in which the students reside; and
- 5 (2) prepare students who have a visual impairment for
- 6 independent functioning as adults [and shall consider information
- 7 from sources throughout the state regarding the nature of those
- 8 programs and students to be served].
- 9 (g) At the request of a school district or other public or
- 10 private educational entity, the school may conduct an assessment of
- 11 <u>a student served by the district or other educational entity. The</u>
- 12 school may charge a reasonable fee to the district or other
- 13 educational entity for conducting the assessment.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 30.051, Education Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- Sec. 30.051. PURPOSE OF TEXAS SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF. (a) The
- 17 Texas School for the Deaf is a state agency established to serve as
- 18 a special school in the continuum of statewide placements for
- 19 students [provide educational services to persons] who are 21 years
- of age or younger on September 1 of any school year and who are deaf
- or hard of hearing and who may have one or more other disabilities.
- 22 The school shall provide:
- 23 (1) comprehensive educational services, on a day or
- 24 residential basis; and
- 25 (2) short-term programs, including summer programs,
- 26 [services] to:
- 27 (A) enable students who are deaf or hard of

- 1 hearing to develop skills so that they can benefit from educational
- 2 programs offered by the school districts in which the students
- 3 reside; and
- 4 (B) prepare students who are deaf or hard of
- 5 hearing for independent functioning as adults [allow a student to
- 6 better achieve educational results from services available in the
- 7 community; and
- 8 [(3) services for any student who is deaf or hard of
- 9 hearing and also has an additional disability and who requires a
- 10 specialized support program but does not require a residential
- 11 treatment facility].
- 12 (b) The school shall serve as a primary statewide resource
- 13 center promoting excellence in education for students who are deaf
- or hard of hearing through research, training, and demonstration
- projects by providing services such as:
- 16 (1) developing and providing local, regional, and
- 17 statewide training for parents of students who are deaf or hard of
- 18 hearing and professionals who work with students who are deaf or
- 19 hard of hearing;
- 20 (2) providing consultation and technical assistance
- 21 to parents and professionals related to special education and
- 22 <u>related services for students;</u>
- 23 (3) supporting the needs of students, parents, and
- 24 families through videoconferencing and distance learning;
- 25 (4) developing and disseminating reference materials,
- 26 <u>including materials in the areas of curriculum</u>, instructional
- 27 methodology, and educational technology;

- 1 (5) providing information related to library
- 2 resources, adapted materials, current research, and technology
- 3 resources, and teaching, assessment, and transition of students who
- 4 are deaf or hard of hearing;
- 5 (6) operating programs for lending educational and
- 6 technological materials to school districts, regional education
- 7 <u>service centers</u>, and parents; and
- 8 (7) facilitating the preparation of teachers for
- 9 students who are deaf or hard of hearing.
- 10 (c) At the request of a school district or other public or
- 11 private educational entity, the school may conduct an assessment of
- 12 a student served by the district or other educational entity. The
- 13 school may charge a reasonable fee to the district or other
- 14 educational entity for conducting the assessment [The school shall
- 15 work in partnership with state, regional, and local agencies to
- 16 provide new or improved programs or methods to serve the previously
- 17 unmet or future needs of persons throughout the state who are deaf
- 18 or hard of hearing].
- 19 (d) The school shall cooperate with public and private
- 20 agencies and organizations serving students and other persons who
- 21 are deaf or <u>hard of</u> hearing [impaired] in the planning,
- 22 development, and implementation of effective educational and
- 23 rehabilitative service delivery systems associated with educating
- 24 students who are deaf or hard of hearing. To maximize and make
- 25 efficient use of state facilities, funding, and resources, the
- 26 services provided in this area may include conducting a cooperative
- 27 program with other agencies to serve persons who have graduated

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- 1 from high school and who have identified needs related to
- 2 vocational training, independent living skills, [and] social and
- 3 leisure skills, compensatory skills, or remedial academic skills.
- 4 (e) The school may not serve students whose needs are
- 5 appropriately addressed in a home or hospital setting or in a
- 6 <u>residential treatment facility.</u>
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
- 8 school year.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
