## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to access to criminal history record information 3 concerning employees, volunteers, and applicant volunteers of 4 children's advocacy centers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subdivision (3), Subsection (a), Section 411.114, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 8 (3) The Department of Protective and Regulatory Services is entitled to obtain from the department criminal history 9 record information maintained by the department that relates to a 10 person who is: 11 12 (A) a volunteer or applicant volunteer with a 13 local affiliate in this state of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of 14 America; 15 (B) a volunteer or applicant volunteer with the "I Have a Dream/Houston" program; 16 a volunteer or applicant volunteer with an 17 (C) organization that provides court-appointed special advocates for 18 19 abused or neglected children; a person providing, at the request of the 20 (D) child's parent, in-home care for a child who is the subject of a 21 22 report alleging the child has been abused or neglected; 23 a volunteer or applicant volunteer with a (E) Texas chapter of the Make-a-Wish Foundation of America; 24

No. 602 a person providing, at the request of the 1 (F) 2 child's parent, in-home care for a child only if the person gives written consent to the release and disclosure of the information; 3 a child who is related to the caretaker, as 4 (G) determined under Section 42.002, Human Resources Code, and who 5 resides in or is present in a child-care facility, family home, or 6 7 maternity home, other than a child described by Subdivision (2)(C), or any other person who has unsupervised access to a child in the 8 9 care of a child-care facility, family home, or maternity home; applicant for a position with 10 an (H) the 11 Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, other than a position described by Subdivision (2)(D), regardless of the duties 12 13 of the position; (I) a volunteer or applicant volunteer with the 14 15 Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, other than a 16 registered volunteer, regardless of the duties to be performed; 17 (J) a person providing or applying to provide 18 in-home, adoptive, or foster care for children to the extent necessary to comply with Subchapter B, Chapter 162, Family Code; 19 a Department of Protective and Regulatory 20 (K) Services employee, other than an employee described by Subdivision 21 22 (2)(H), regardless of the duties of the employee's position; a relative of a child in the care of the (L) 23 Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, to the extent 24 25 necessary to comply with Section 162.007, Family Code; a person, other than the subject of a report 26 (M) 27 described in Subdivision (2)(I), living in the residence in which

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1 the alleged victim of the report resides;

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2 (N) a contractor or an employee of a contractor 3 who delivers services to a ward of the Department of Protective and 4 Regulatory Services under a contract with the estate of the ward; 5 [<del>or</del>]

6 (O) a person who seeks unsupervised visits with a 7 ward of the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, 8 including a relative of the ward<u>; or</u>

9 <u>(P) an employee, volunteer, or applicant</u> 10 <u>volunteer of a children's advocacy center under Subchapter E,</u> 11 <u>Chapter 264, Family Code</u>.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
