2	relating to the composition of the Drug Demand Reduction Advisory
3	Committee.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subsections (a) and (e), Section 461.017, Health
6	and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
7	(a) The Drug Demand Reduction Advisory Committee is
8	composed of the following [ <del>20</del> ] members:
9	(1) five representatives of the public from different
10	geographic regions of the state who have knowledge and expertise in
11	issues relating to reducing drug demand and who are appointed by the
12	executive director of the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug
13	Abuse; and
14	(2) one representative of each of the following
15	agencies or offices who is appointed by the executive director or
16	commissioner of the agency or office and who is directly involved in
17	the agency's or office's policies, programs, or funding activities
18	relating to reducing drug demand:
19	(A) the criminal justice division of the
20	governor's office;
21	(B) the Criminal Justice Policy Council;
22	(C) the Department of Protective and Regulatory
23	Services;
24	(D) the Department of Public Safety of the State

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1	of Texas;
2	(E) the Health and Human Services Commission;
3	(F) the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission;
4	(G) the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug
5	Abuse;
6	(H) the Texas Council on Offenders with Mental
7	Impairments;
8	(I) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
9	(J) the Texas Department of Health;
10	(K) the Texas Department of Human Services;
11	(L) the Texas Department of Mental Health and
12	Mental Retardation;
13	(M) the Texas Education Agency;
14	(N) the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission;
15	[and]
16	(O) the Texas Youth Commission <u>;</u>
17	(P) the Texas Rehabilitation Commission;
18	(Q) the Texas Workforce Commission;
19	(R) the Texas Department of Transportation;
20	(S) the comptroller of public accounts; and
21	(T) the adjutant general's department.
22	(e) The Drug Demand Reduction Advisory Committee shall
23	develop a statewide strategy to reduce drug demand. The strategy
24	must:
25	(1) incorporate multidisciplinary approaches using
26	current empirical research;
27	(2) include performance-based measurement and

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1 accountability standards, short-term objectives, and ten-year 2 targets for reducing drug demand;

3 (3) coordinate, to the extent possible, the efforts of
4 private sector entities and local, state, and federal agencies,
5 including the Office of National Drug Control Policy <u>and the United</u>
6 <u>States Drug Enforcement Administration</u>, to reduce drug demand; and

7 (4) provide opportunities for representatives from
8 the public and private sectors to comment on the committee's
9 activities and make recommendations related to the strategy.

SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 10 of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts, the adjutant 11 general, and the executive directors of the Texas Rehabilitation 12 Texas Workforce Commission, and 13 Commission, the the Texas Department of Transportation shall each appoint one representative 14 15 to the Drug Demand Reduction Advisory Committee under Section 16 461.017, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
