SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts, the adjutant general, and the executive directors of the Texas Rehabilitation Commission, the Texas Workforce Commission, and the Texas Department of Transportation shall each appoint one representative to the Drug Demand Reduction Advisory Committee under Section 461.017, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
