Section 387.005, Health and Safety Code, is 22 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 23 (f) If a member of the Texas Council on Environmental Technology is an employee or owner of an entity that applies for a 24

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1	grant under this chapter, the member, before a vote on the grant,
2	shall disclose the fact of the member's employment or ownership.
3	The disclosure must be entered into the minutes of the meeting. The
4	member may not vote on or otherwise participate in the awarding of
5	the grant. If the member does not comply with this subsection, the
6	entity is not eligible for the grant.
7	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
8	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
9	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
LO	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 11

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
