- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 545.352(b), Transportation Code, as
- 5 amended by Chapters 663, 739, and 1346, Acts of the 76th
- 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, is reenacted and amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) Unless a special hazard exists that requires a slower
- 9 speed for compliance with Section 545.351(b), the following speeds
- 10 are lawful:
- 11 (1) 30 miles per hour in an urban district on a street
- other than an alley and 15 miles per hour in an alley;
- 13 (2) 70 miles per hour in daytime and 65 miles per hour
- in nighttime if the vehicle is on a highway numbered by this state
- 15 or the United States outside an urban district, including a
- 16 farm-to-market or ranch-to-market road, except as provided by
- 17 Subdivision (4);
- 18 (3) 60 miles per hour in daytime and 55 miles per hour
- in nighttime if the vehicle is on a highway that is outside an urban
- 20 district and:
- 21 (A) the highway is not a highway numbered by this
- 22 state or the United States; or
- 23 (B) the highway does not have a paved surface
- 24 more than 22 feet wide and does not have an improved shoulder on

- 1 both sides of the highway, except that this paragraph does not apply
- 2 to a part of a highway that narrows to a paved surface 22 feet wide
- 3 or less or does not have an improved shoulder on both sides of the
- 4 highway solely due to the highway crossing a bridge, overpass, or
- 5 similar structure;
- 6 (4) outside an urban district:
- 7 (A) 60 miles per hour if the vehicle is a school
- 8 bus that has passed a commercial motor vehicle inspection under
- 9 Section 548.201 and is on a highway numbered by the United States or
- 10 this state, including a farm-to-market road;
- 11 (B) 50 miles per hour if the vehicle is a school
- 12 bus that:
- 13 (i) has not passed a commercial motor
- vehicle inspection under Section 548.201; or
- 15 (ii) is traveling on a highway not numbered
- 16 by the United States or this state; or
- 17 (C) 60 miles per hour in daytime and 55 miles per
- 18 hour in nighttime if:
- 19 (i) the vehicle is a truck, other than a
- 20 light truck, or [if] the vehicle is a truck tractor, trailer, or
- 21 semitrailer; and
- 22 (ii) the vehicle is on a farm-to-market or
- 23 ranch-to-market road;
- 24 (5) on a beach, 15 miles per hour; or
- 25 (6) on a county road adjacent to a public beach, 15
- 26 miles per hour, if declared by the commissioners court of the
- 27 county.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 545.353(d), Transportation Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (h), the commission may
- 4 not:
- 5 (1) modify the rules established by Section
- 6 545.351(b);
- 7 (2) establish a speed limit of more than 70 miles per
- 8 hour; or
- 9 (3) increase the speed limit for a vehicle described
- 10 by Section 545.352(b)(4) [545.352(b)(5)].
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 548.201(b), Transportation Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) A program under this section also applies to any:
- 14 (1) vehicle or combination of vehicles with a gross
- 15 weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds that is operated in
- 16 interstate commerce and registered in this state;
- 17 (2) school activity bus, as defined in Section
- 18 541.201, that has a gross weight, registered weight, or gross
- 19 weight rating of more than 26,000 pounds, or is designed to
- 20 transport more than 15 passengers, including the driver; and
- 21 (3) school bus that will operate at a speed authorized
- 22 by Section 545.352(b)(4)(A) [545.352(b)(5)(A)].
- 23 SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 24 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 25 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before
- 26 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 27 occurred before that date.

- 1 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 2 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 3 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
