1-6 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to compensatory time off for certain persons who are  
1-9 employed by the state as peace officers.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 662.005, Government  
1-12 Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-13 (b) Except as provided by Section 662.010, and  
1-14 notwithstanding Section 659.015 or another law, a state employee  
1-15 who is a peace officer commissioned by a state officer or state  
1-16 agency listed under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, [~~the~~  
1-17 ~~Department of Public Safety~~] and who is required to work on a  
1-18 national or state holiday that falls on a Saturday or Sunday is  
1-19 entitled to compensatory time off at the rate of one hour for each  
1-20 hour worked on the holiday.

1-21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-25 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
