## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of school districts to purchase 3 electricity through a political subdivision corporation. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 44.031, Education Code, 5 6 is amended to read as follows: 7 Except as provided by this subchapter, all school district contracts, except contracts for the purchase of produce or 8 vehicle fuel, valued at \$25,000 or more in the aggregate for each 9 12-month period shall be made by the method, of the following 10 methods, that provides the best value for the district: 11 12 (1) competitive bidding; 13 (2) competitive sealed proposals; 14 (3) a request for proposals, for services other than construction services; 15 (4) a catalogue purchase as provided by Subchapter B, 16

- (5) an interlocal contract;
- 19 (6) a design/build contract;

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- 20 (7) a contract to construct, rehabilitate, alter, or
- 21 repair facilities that involves using a construction manager;
- 22 (8) a job order contract for the minor construction,
- 23 repair, rehabilitation, or alteration of a facility; [or]
- 24 (9) the reverse auction procedure as defined by

- 1 Section 2155.062(d), Government Code; or
- 2 (10) the formation of a political subdivision
- 3 corporation under Section 304.001, Local Government Code.
- 4 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 304.001, Local
- 5 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) In this chapter, "political subdivision" means a
- 7 county, municipality, <u>school district</u>, hospital district, or any
- 8 other political subdivision receiving electric service from an
- 9 entity that has implemented customer choice, as defined in Section
- 10 31.002, Utilities Code.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
