A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishment of a public education Internet portal.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter D to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER D. EDUCATION INTERNET PORTAL
7	Sec. 32.151. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "portal"
8	means the education Internet portal required by this subchapter.
9	Sec. 32.152. EDUCATION INTERNET PORTAL; GENERAL PURPOSES.
10	(a) The agency, with assistance from the Department of Information
11	Resources and with participation by the Texas Higher Education
12	Coordinating Board, interested school districts, and interested
13	persons in the private sector, shall establish and maintain an
14	education Internet portal for use by school districts, teachers,
15	parents, and students.
16	(b) The portal must serve as a single point of access to
17	educational resources. In addition to any other purpose specified
18	by this subchapter or any other educational purpose, the portal may
19	be used to:
20	(1) alleviate inequities in access to educational
21	resources by providing access to on-line courses;
22	(2) improve student academic performance by providing
23	access to tutorial materials, instructional materials that have
24	been shown to improve academic performance, and other interactive

- 1 materials, including materials that assess an individual student's
- 2 knowledge and prepare the student for the administration of a
- 3 standardized assessment instrument, including an assessment
- 4 instrument administered under Section 39.023;
- 5 (3) provide school districts with access to
- 6 administrative software and other electronic tools designed to
- 7 promote administrative efficiency and intra-district
- 8 <u>communication;</u>
- 9 (4) provide secure access to student assessment data;
- 10 or
- 11 (5) provide links to appropriate educational
- 12 resources and experts available through the Internet.
- Sec. 32.153. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The agency has
- 14 responsibility for general administration and oversight of the
- 15 portal and for approving the content of all information made
- 16 available through the portal.
- 17 (b) The Department of Information Resources shall:
- 18 (1) host the portal through the project known as
- 19 TexasOnline;
- 20 (2) organize the portal in a manner that simplifies
- 21 portal use and administration;
- 22 (3) provide any necessary technical advice to the
- 23 agency, including advice relating to equipment required in
- 24 connection with the portal;
- 25 (4) provide a method for maintaining the information
- 26 made available through the portal; and
- 27 (5) cooperate with the agency in linking the agency's

- 1 Internet site to the portal.
- 2 (c) The Department of Information Resources may assist the
- 3 agency with technical advice regarding contracting with vendors for
- 4 services in connection with the portal.
- 5 (d) The joint advisory committee established under Section
- 6 61.077, or any successor to that committee with advisory
- 7 responsibility for coordination between secondary and
- 8 postsecondary education, shall serve in an advisory capacity to the
- 9 agency and the Department of Information Resources in connection
- 10 with functions relating to the portal.
- Sec. 32.154. ON-LINE COURSES. (a) The agency may
- 12 coordinate the identification and development of on-line courses
- 13 made available through the portal. A course may not be made
- 14 available through the portal unless the course is reviewed by the
- agency and approved by the commissioner.
- 16 (b) In coordinating, developing, and reviewing courses to
- 17 be made available through the portal, the agency shall give
- 18 priority to any course that is not readily available to students
- 19 throughout the state and for which there is a critical need.
- 20 (c) A course made available through the portal must be
- 21 aligned with state curriculum requirements under Section 28.002 and
- 22 the essential knowledge and skills identified under that section.
- 23 (d) The agency may develop quality assurance criteria to be
- 24 used by the agency in developing and reviewing courses made
- 25 available through the portal. The criteria must include components
- 26 relating to:
- 27 (1) course content;

Τ	(2) instructor qualifications;
2	(3) validity of assessment procedures;
3	(4) security features; and
4	(5) degree of interactivity.
5	Sec. 32.155. ON-LINE COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS. (a) Using funds
6	available for that purpose, the agency may award a scholarship for
7	the costs of an on-line course to a student who demonstrates that:
8	(1) the student has inequitable access to the course;
9	and
10	(2) access to the course would improve the likelihood
11	of the student's academic success.
12	(b) The commissioner may adopt criteria to be used in
13	awarding scholarships under this section. The criteria must limit
14	the availability of scholarships to students who:
15	(1) are enrolled in a public school on a full-time
16	basis; or
17	(2) were enrolled in a public school on a full-time
18	basis for at least three months during the preceding school year and
19	indicate an intent to enroll in a public school on a full-time basis
20	for at least three months during the school year for which the
21	scholarship is offered.
22	Sec. 32.156. ON-LINE TEXTBOOKS. (a) The agency may
23	develop and adopt strategies for making textbooks available through
24	the portal or through other means in an electronic format as an
25	alternative or supplement to traditional textbooks.
26	(b) In developing and adopting strategies under this

section, the agency shall seek to achieve a system under which a

- 1 student may, in addition to a traditional textbook, be provided
- 2 with secure Internet access to each textbook used by the student.
- 3 Sec. 32.157. SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE SOFTWARE AND
- 4 ELECTRONIC TOOLS. (a) The agency may:
- 5 (1) identify effective Internet-based administrative
- 6 software and other electronic tools that may be used by school
- 7 districts to improve district administrative functions; and
- 8 (2) pursue efforts to make that software and other
- 9 electronic tools available through the portal for use by school
- 10 districts on a voluntary basis.
- 11 (b) The agency may assist school districts in identifying
- 12 sources of funding that may be used by districts to pay any costs
- 13 associated with using administrative software and other electronic
- 14 tools available through the portal. To the extent that funds are
- 15 available to the agency, the agency may provide administrative
- software and other electronic tools through the portal at no cost to
- 17 specific school districts selected by the agency based on
- demonstrated need.
- 19 Sec. 32.158. STUDENT ASSESSMENT DATA. (a) The agency may
- 20 establish a secure, interoperable system to be implemented through
- 21 the portal under which school districts can readily access student
- 22 <u>assessment data for use in developing strategies for improving</u>
- 23 student performance.
- (b) In establishing the system required by this section, the
- 25 agency shall seek to further the goal of providing school districts
- 26 with access to student performance information at the classroom
- 27 level.

- Sec. 32.159. FEES. (a) The agency may charge school
 districts, teachers, parents, students, and other persons a
 reasonable fee for services or information provided through the
 portal.
- 5 (b) The total amount of fees charged under this section may
 6 not exceed the amount necessary to pay costs associated with the
 7 development, administration, and maintenance of the portal.
- 8 (c) An individual fee charged to a person under this section
 9 for a service or information may not exceed the amount that the
 10 person would be required to pay to obtain the service or information
 11 from a commercial source or through another means of access other
 12 than the portal.
- 13 (d) To the extent possible, the agency shall make services

 14 and information available through the portal at no cost to school

 15 districts, teachers, parents, students, and other persons.
- Sec. 32.160. VENDOR PARTICIPATION. (a) The agency may seek proposals from private vendors for providing on-line courses or other materials or services through the portal in accordance with this subchapter. A vendor may not provide an on-line course or other material or service through the portal without approval by the agency.
- 22 <u>(b) The agency may require a vendor, as a condition of</u>
 23 approval of the vendor's proposal, to:
- 24 <u>(1) pay:</u>
- 25 (A) all or part of the costs of providing the con-line course or other material or service;
- 27 (B) an access fee to be used by the agency in

paying the general costs of maintaining the portal; or 1 2 (C) both the amounts described by Paragraphs (A) 3 and (B); and 4 (2) if applicable, provide on-line course scholarships to students in accordance with criteria adopted by the 5 6 commissioner. 7 Sec. 32.161. FUNDING. (a) The agency may not use general revenue funds to pay the costs of developing, administering, and 8 maintaining the portal. The agency may use amounts available to the 9 10 agency from: (1) gifts, grants, or donations; 11 (2) vendor payments described by Section 32.160(b); or 12 13 (3) arrangements with nonprofit or private entities 14 approved by the agency. 15 (b) To the extent possible considering other statutory 16 requirements, the commissioner and agency shall encourage the use of textbook funds and technology allotment funds under Section 17 18 31.021(b)(2) in a manner that facilitates the development and use of the portal. 19 Sec. 32.162. STATEWIDE LICENSING AND CONTRACTING. 20 As appropriate to promote the availability through the portal of 21 22 services and information specified by this subchapter at no cost to users or at a reasonable cost, the agency may negotiate statewide 23 licenses or discounts with software vendors and other persons 24 25 offering applications that are suitable for use through the portal.

Sec. 32.163. OUTREACH AND TRAINING. (a) The agency may

- 1 portal to school districts, teachers, parents, and students.
- 2 (b) The agency may provide training to school districts and
- 3 teachers in use of the portal. Training in use of the portal may be
- 4 made available to parents and students by the agency or school
- 5 districts, as determined by commissioner rule.
- 6 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2005, the Texas
- 7 Education Agency shall submit a report to the legislature that
- 8 contains recommendations for maximizing the benefits of providing
- 9 access to textbooks or other educational materials through the
- 10 Internet using the education Internet portal required by Subchapter
- 11 D, Chapter 32, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. The Texas Education Agency and the Department of
- 13 Information Resources shall coordinate agency and department
- 14 activities in implementing Subchapter D, Chapter 32, Education
- 15 Code, as added by this Act, with relevant ongoing activities
- 16 relating to modification of the Public Education Information
- 17 Management System (PEIMS) and other systems necessary to conform
- 18 state educational reporting processes with educational reporting
- 19 requirements imposed by federal law.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
