## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to establishment of a public education Internet portal.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Education Code, is amended by adding
5	Subchapter D to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER D. EDUCATION INTERNET PORTAL
7	Sec. 32.151. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "portal"
8	means the education Internet portal required by this subchapter.
9	Sec. 32.152. EDUCATION INTERNET PORTAL; GENERAL PURPOSES.
LO	(a) The agency, with assistance from the Department of Information
11	Resources and with participation by the Texas Higher Education
12	Coordinating Board, interested school districts, and interested
13	persons in the private sector, shall establish and maintain ar
14	education Internet portal for use by school districts, teachers,
15	parents, and students.
16	(b) The portal must serve as a single point of access to
L7	educational resources. In addition to any other purpose specified
18	by this subchapter or any other educational purpose, the portal may
19	be used to:
20	(1) alleviate inequities in access to educational
21	resources by providing access to on-line courses;
22	(2) improve student academic performance by providing
23	access to tutorial materials and other interactive materials,
24	including materials that assess an individual student's knowledge

- 1 and prepare the student for the administration of a standardized
- 2 assessment instrument, including an assessment instrument
- 3 administered under Section 39.023;
- 4 (3) provide school districts with access to
- 5 administrative software and other electronic tools designed to
- 6 promote administrative efficiency and intra-district
- 7 <u>communication;</u>
- 8 (4) provide secure access to student assessment data;
- 9 or
- 10 (5) provide links to appropriate educational
- 11 resources and experts available through the Internet.
- Sec. 32.153. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The agency has
- 13 responsibility for general administration and oversight of the
- 14 portal and for approving the content of all information made
- 15 available through the portal.
- 16 (b) The Department of Information Resources shall:
- 17 (1) provide the infrastructure necessary for the
- 18 portal;
- 19 (2) organize the portal in a manner that simplifies
- 20 portal use and administration;
- 21 (3) provide any necessary technical advice to the
- 22 agency, including advice relating to equipment required in
- 23 connection with the portal;
- 24 (4) assist the agency in contracting with vendors for
- 25 services in connection with the portal;
- 26 (5) provide a method for maintaining the information
- 27 made available through the portal; and

(6) cooperate with the agency in linking the agency's 1 2 Internet site to the portal. 3 (b) The joint advisory committee established under Section 4 61.077, or any successor to that committee with advisory responsibility for coordination between secondary and 5 6 postsecondary education, shall serve in an advisory capacity to the 7 agency and the Department of Information Resources in connection 8 with functions relating to the portal. Sec. 32.154. ON-LINE COURSES. (a) The agency shall 9 coordinate the identification and development of on-line courses 10 made available through the portal. A course may not be made 11 available through the portal unless the course is reviewed by the 12 agency and approved by the commissioner. 13 (b) In coordinating, developing, and reviewing courses to 14 15 be made available through the portal, the agency shall give 16 priority to any course that is not readily available to students 17 throughout the state and for which there is a critical need. (c) A course made available through the portal must be 18 aligned with state curriculum requirements under Section 28.002 and 19 20 the essential knowledge and skills identified under that section. 21 (d) The agency shall develop quality assurance criteria to be used by the agency in developing and reviewing courses made 22 available through the portal. The criteria must include components 23 24 relating to: 25 (1) course content;

(3) validity of assessment procedures;

(2) instructor qualifications;

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1	(4) security features; and
2	(5) degree of interactivity.
3	(e) The agency shall seek proposals from vendors and school
4	districts for providing courses to students, school districts, and
5	parents.
6	Sec. 32.155. ON-LINE COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS. (a) Using funds
7	available for that purpose, the agency may award a scholarship for
8	the costs of an on-line course to a student who demonstrates that:
9	(1) the student has inequitable access to the course;
10	<u>and</u>
11	(2) access to the course would improve the likelihood
12	of the student's academic success.
13	(b) The commissioner shall adopt criteria to be used in
14	awarding scholarships under this section.
15	Sec. 32.156. ON-LINE TEXTBOOKS. (a) The agency shall
16	develop and adopt strategies for making textbooks available through
17	the portal or through other means in an electronic format as an
18	alternative or supplement to traditional textbooks.
19	(b) In developing and adopting strategies under this
20	section, the agency shall seek to achieve a system under which a
21	student may, in addition to a traditional textbook, be provided
22	with secure Internet access to each textbook used by the student.
23	Sec. 32.157. SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE SOFTWARE AND
24	ELECTRONIC TOOLS. (a) The agency shall:
25	(1) identify effective Internet-based administrative
26	software and other electronic tools that may be used by school

districts to improve district administrative functions; and

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- 1 (2) pursue efforts to make that software and other
  2 electronic tools available through the portal for use by school
- 3 districts on a voluntary basis.
- 4 (b) The agency shall assist school districts in identifying
- 5 sources of funding that may be used by districts to pay any costs
- 6 associated with using administrative software and other electronic
- 7 tools available through the portal. To the extent that funds are
- 8 available to the agency, the agency may provide administrative
- 9 software and other electronic tools through the portal at no cost to
- 10 specific school districts selected by the agency based on
- 11 demonstrated need.
- 12 Sec. 32.158. STUDENT ASSESSMENT DATA. (a) The agency shall
- 13 establish a secure, interoperable system to be implemented through
- 14 the portal under which school districts can readily access student
- 15 assessment data for use in developing strategies for improving
- 16 <u>student performance.</u>
- 17 (b) In establishing the system required by this section, the
- agency shall seek to further the goal of providing school districts
- 19 with access to student performance information at the classroom
- 20 level.
- Sec. 32.159. FEES. (a) The agency may charge school
- 22 <u>districts</u>, teachers, parents, students, and other persons a
- 23 reasonable fee for services or information provided through the
- 24 portal.
- 25 (b) The total amount of fees charged under this section may
- 26 not exceed the amount necessary to pay costs associated with
- 27 administering the portal.

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- (c) An individual fee charged to a person under this section 1 2 for a service or information may not exceed the amount that the person would be required to pay to obtain the service or information 3 4 from a commercial source or through another means of access other 5
- 6 (d) To the extent possible, the agency shall make services 7 and information available through the portal at no cost to school 8 districts, teachers, parents, students, and other persons.

than the portal.

- Sec. 32.160. FUNDING. As provided by Section 57.046, 9 Utilities Code, and the General Appropriations Act, the agency 10 shall pay the costs of establishing and maintaining the portal 11 12 using amounts available to the agency from the telecommunications infrastructure fund. 13
- Sec. 32.161. STATEWIDE LICENSING AND CONTRACTING. 14 15 appropriate to promote the availability through the portal of services and information specified by this subchapter at no cost to 16 17 users or at a reasonable cost, the agency shall negotiate statewide licenses or discounts with software vendors and other persons 18 19 offering applications that are suitable for use through the portal.
- Sec. 32.162. OUTREACH AND TRAINING. (a) The agency shall 20 21 conduct outreach activities to provide information regarding the portal to school districts, teachers, parents, and students. 22
- (b) The agency shall provide training to school districts 23 and teachers in use of the portal. Training in use of the portal 24 shall be made available to parents and students by the agency or 25 26 school districts, as determined by commissioner rule.
- 27 SECTION 2. Section 57.046(a), Utilities Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (a) The board shall use money in the public schools account
- 3 to fund the education Internet portal established under Subchapter
- 4 D, Chapter 32, Education Code. The board shall use any remaining
- 5 money in the public schools account to award grants and loans in
- 6 accordance with this subchapter to fund:
- 7 (1) equipment for public schools, including
- 8 computers, printers, computer labs, and video equipment; and
- 9 (2) intracampus and intercampus wiring to enable those
- 10 public schools to use the equipment.
- 11 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2005, the Texas
- 12 Education Agency shall submit a report to the legislature that
- 13 contains recommendations for maximizing the benefits of providing
- 14 access to textbooks or other educational materials through the
- 15 Internet using the education Internet portal required by Subchapter
- 16 D, Chapter 32, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 4. The Texas Education Agency and the Department of
- 18 Information Resources shall coordinate agency and department
- 19 activities in implementing Subchapter D, Chapter 32, Education
- 20 Code, as added by this Act, with relevant ongoing activities
- 21 relating to modification of the Public Education Information
- 22 Management System (PEIMS) and other systems necessary to conform
- 23 state educational reporting processes with educational reporting
- 24 requirements imposed by federal law.
- 25 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
