- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 263.152, Local
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commissioners court of a county may:
- 8 (1) periodically sell the county's surplus or salvage
- 9 property by competitive bid or auction, except that competitive
- 10 bidding or an auction is not necessary if the purchaser is another
- 11 county or a political subdivision within the county that is selling
- 12 the surplus or salvage property;
- 13 (2) offer the property as a trade-in for new property
- of the same general type if the commissioners court considers that
- action to be in the best interests of the county; [or]
- 16 (3) order any of the property to be destroyed or
- 17 otherwise disposed of as worthless if the commissioners court
- 18 undertakes to sell that property under Subdivision (1) and is
- unable to do so because no bids are made; or
- 20 (4) dispose of the property by donating it to a civic
- 21 or charitable organization located in the county if the
- 22 <u>commissioners court determines that:</u>
- (A) undertaking to sell the property under
- 24 Subdivision (1) would likely result in no bids or a bid price that

- 1 is less than the county's expenses required for the bid process;
- 2 (B) the donation serves a public purpose; and
- 3 (C) the organization will provide the county with
- 4 adequate consideration, such as relieving the county of
- 5 transportation or disposal expenses related to the property.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 285, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Subchapter Z to read as follows:
- 8 <u>SUBCHAPTER Z. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS</u>
- 9 Sec. 285.901. DISPOSITION OF SALVAGE AND SURPLUS PROPERTY.
- 10 (a) In this section:
- 11 (1) "Salvage property" has the meaning assigned by
- 12 Section 263.151, Local Government Code.
- 13 (2) "Surplus property" has the meaning assigned by
- 14 Section 263.151, Local Government Code.
- 15 (b) The governing board of a hospital district may dispose
- of the hospital district's surplus or salvage property in the same
- 17 way that a commissioners court of a county may dispose of the
- 18 county's surplus or salvage property under Section 263.152, Local
- 19 Government Code.
- SECTION 3. Subsection (c), Section 263.152, Local
- 21 Government Code, is repealed.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
