- 2 relating to a disclosure of certain employment by an executive 3 committee member of the Office of Rural Community Affairs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 487, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 487.059 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 487.059. DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN EMPLOYMENT. (a) In
- 8 this section, "monetary award" means any money, fund, stipend,
- 9 grant, scholarship, loan, or loan guarantee awarded under this
- 10 <u>chapter.</u>
- 11 <u>(b) This section applies to a member of the executive</u>
 12 committee who is employed by:
- 13 <u>(1) an entity that applies for a monetary award or</u>
 14 offers to enter into a contract with the office; or
- (2) an entity that is under common ownership or
- 16 governance with or otherwise affiliated with an entity that applies
- 17 <u>for a monetary award or offers to enter into a contract with the</u>
- 18 <u>office.</u>
- 19 (c) The committee member shall, before a vote on the
- 20 monetary award or contract, disclose the fact of the member's
- 21 employment by the entity. The executive committee shall enter the
- 22 disclosure into the minutes of the meeting at which a vote on the
- 23 monetary award or contract is taken. The executive committee
- 24 member may not vote on or otherwise participate in a discussion or

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- 1 any other activity that relates to awarding the monetary award or
- 2 contract.
- 3 (d) If the executive committee member does not comply with
- 4 this section, the entity is not eligible to be awarded the monetary
- 5 award or contract.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
