- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 76.109, Agriculture Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows:
- 7 (h) This section does not prohibit an employee of a
- 8 political subdivision who does not hold a commercial or
- 9 noncommercial applicator license from applying a general use
- 10 pesticide in an incidental use situation.
- (i) In this section, "incidental use situation" has the
- meaning assigned by Section 1951.303, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 2. Section 1951.053, Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Sections 1951.212 and
- 17 1951.457(c), this chapter does not apply to:
- 18 (1) a person who performs pest control work on growing
- 19 plants, trees, shrubs, grass, or other horticultural plants if the
- 20 person:
- 21 (A) holds a florist or nursery registration
- 22 certificate from the Department of Agriculture under Section
- 23 71.043, Agriculture Code, other than a registration certificate
- 24 that permits the sale, lease, or distribution of nursery products

- 1 or floral items only at a temporary market; and
- 2 (B) holds a commercial or noncommercial
- 3 applicator license from the Department of Agriculture that covers
- 4 the pest control work; [or]
- 5 (2) a person who performs pest control work on growing
- 6 plants, trees, shrubs, grass, or other horticultural plants or
- 7 rights-of-way if the person:
- 8 (A) is employed by a political subdivision or a
- 9 cemetery;
- 10 (B) is engaged in pest control work or vegetation
- 11 management for the political subdivision or cemetery;
- 12 (C) holds a commercial or noncommercial
- 13 applicator license from the Department of Agriculture that covers
- 14 pest control work or is under the direct supervision of a person who
- 15 holds a commercial or noncommercial applicator license from the
- 16 Department of Agriculture that covers pest control work; and
- 17 (D) complies with annual continuing education
- 18 required by the Department of Agriculture; or
- 19 (3) an employee of a political subdivision who applies
- 20 a general use pesticide in an incidental use situation.
- 21 (c) In this section, "incidental use situation" has the
- meaning assigned by Section 1951.303.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2003, if it
- 24 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 25 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 26 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that
- 27 date, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
