4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 76.109, Agriculture Code, is amended by 6 adding Subsection (h) to read as follows:

- (h) Neither this section nor any other law shall prohibit a political subdivision from reducing the number of hours of training or other requirements for an employee conducting larval mosquito control on property owned or controlled by the political subdivision using biological pesticides approved for general use by the Texas Department of Health, provided the employee is given instructions adequate to ensure the safe and effective use of such pesticides.
- SECTION 2. Section 1951.053, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- (c) Neither this section nor any other law shall prohibit a 17 political subdivision from reducing the number of hours of training 18 19 or other requirements for an employee conducting larval mosquito control on property owned or controlled by the political 20 subdivision using biological pesticides approved for general use by 21 the Texas Department of Health, provided the employee is given 22 23 instructions adequate to ensure the safe and effective use of such 24 pesticides.
