- 5 SECTION 1. CREATION OF DISTRICT. (a) Harris County Road
- 6 Improvement District No. 1 is created as a special district under
- 7 Section 52, Article III and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas
- 8 Constitution.

- 9 (b) The board by resolution may change the district's name.
- 10 SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The creation of the
- 11 district is necessary to promote, develop, encourage, and maintain
- 12 transportation, safety, employment, commerce, housing, tourism,
- 13 recreation, arts, entertainment, economic development, and the
- 14 public welfare in the area of the district.
- 15 (b) The creation of the district is essential to accomplish
- the purposes of Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59,
- 17 Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated
- 18 in this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 20 (1) "Board" means the board of directors of district.
- 21 (2) "County" means Harris County, Texas.
- 22 (3) "District" means Harris County Road Improvement
- 23 District No. 1.
- 24 (4) "Municipality" means the City of Houston, Texas.

- 1 SECTION 4. BOUNDARIES. The district includes all the

- 15 SECTION 5. FINDINGS RELATING TO BOUNDARIES. The boundaries
- and field notes of the district form a closure. If a mistake is made
- in the field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative
- 18 process, the mistake does not affect the district's:
- 19 (1) organization, existence, or validity;
- 20 (2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes
- 21 for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and
- 22 interest on a bond;
- 23 (3) right to impose or collect an assessment or tax; or
- 24 (4) legality or operation.
- 25 SECTION 6. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE.
- 26 (a) The district is created to serve a public use and benefit. All
- 27 the land and other property included in the district will be

- 1 benefited by the improvements and services to be provided by the
- 2 district under powers conferred by Sections 52 and 52-a, Article
- 3 III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and other
- 4 powers granted under this subchapter.
- 5 (b) The creation of the district is in the public interest
- 6 and is essential to:
- 7 (1) further the public purposes of the development and
- 8 diversification of the economy of the state; and
- 9 (2) eliminate unemployment and underemployment and
- 10 develop or expand transportation and commerce.
- 11 (c) The present and prospective traffic congestion in the
- 12 district and the safety of pedestrians and the limited availability
- 13 of funds require the promotion and development of public
- 14 transportation and pedestrian facilities and systems and the
- 15 district will serve the public purpose of securing expanded and
- improved transportation and pedestrian facilities and systems.
- 17 (d) The district will:
- 18 (1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of
- 19 residents, employers, employees, visitors, consumers in the
- 20 district, and the general public;
- 21 (2) provide needed funding to preserve, maintain, and
- 22 enhance the economic health and vitality of the district as a
- 23 community; and
- 24 (3) further promote the health, safety, welfare, and
- 25 enjoyment of the public by providing pedestrian ways and by
- landscaping and developing certain areas in the district, which are
- 27 necessary for the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of

- 1 scenic beauty.
- 2 (e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at
- 3 grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street
- 4 landscaping, and street art objects are parts of and necessary
- 5 components of a street and are considered to be a street or road
- 6 improvement.
- 7 (f) The district will not act as the agent or
- 8 instrumentality of any private interest even though many private
- 9 interests will be benefited by the district, as will the general
- 10 public.
- 11 SECTION 7. POWERS OF DISTRICT. (a) The district has all of
- 12 the powers and duties provided by the general law of this state on
- 13 road districts and road utility districts created under Section 52,
- 14 Article III, Texas Constitution, and on conservation and
- 15 reclamation districts and municipal management districts created
- 16 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, including:
- 17 (1) Chapters 257 and 441, Transportation Code;
- 18 (2) Chapter 375, Local Government Code; and
- 19 (3) Chapters 54 and 49, Water Code.
- 20 (b) The district may impose ad valorem taxes, assessments,
- 21 and impact fees and apply the proceeds of the taxes, assessments or
- 22 impact fees to the payment of debt, to contract payments, or to
- 23 maintenance and operating expenses.
- 24 (c) This Act shall be liberally construed in conformity with
- 25 the legislative findings and purposes set forth in this Act.
- 26 (d) If any provision of the general law is in conflict with
- 27 this Act, this Act prevails. Any general law which supplements the

- 1 power and authority of the district, to the extent not in conflict
- 2 or inconsistent with the Act, is adopted and incorporated by
- 3 reference.
- 4 SECTION 8. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The district is
- 5 governed by a board of five elected directors which shall serve
- 6 staggered terms of four years.
- 7 (b) Director elections shall be conducted in accordance
- 8 with Subchapter D, Chapter 49, Water Code.
- 9 (c) A director may receive compensation as provided by
- 10 Section 49.060, Water Code.
- 11 (d) Section 375.063, Local Government Code, applies to the
- 12 district.
- 13 (d) To the extent not in conflict with the provisions of
- 14 this Act, Subchapter C, Chapter 49, Water Code, applies to the
- 15 district.
- 16 SECTION 9. AGREEMENTS: GENERAL; GIFTS, INTERLOCAL
- 17 AGREEMENTS, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. (a) The district may
- 18 make an agreement with or accept a gift, grant, or loan from any
- 19 person.
- 20 (b) The implementation of a project is a governmental
- 21 function or service for the purposes of Chapter 791, Government
- 22 Code.
- 23 (c) To protect the public interest, the district may
- 24 contract with the municipality or the county to provide law
- 25 enforcement services in the district for a fee.
- 26 SECTION 10. ELECTIONS. (a) The district shall hold an
- 27 election in the manner provided by Chapters 54 and 49, Water Code,

- 1 to obtain voter approval before the district imposes a maintenance
- 2 tax or issues bonds payable from ad valorem taxes.
- 3 (b) The board may include more than one purpose in a single
- 4 proposition at an election.
- 5 SECTION 11. MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If authorized at an
- 6 election held in accordance with Section 16, the district may
- 7 impose and collect an annual ad valorem tax on taxable property in
- 8 the district for the purposes of the district, including the
- 9 maintenance and operation of the district and the improvements
- 10 constructed or acquired by the district or for the provision of
- 11 services.
- 12 (b) The board shall determine the tax rate.
- SECTION 12. ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board may impose and
- 14 collect an assessment for any purpose authorized by this
- 15 subchapter.
- 16 (b) The board may not finance a service or improvement
- 17 project through assessments under this subchapter unless a written
- 18 petition requesting the improvement or service has been filed with
- 19 the board. The petition must be signed by:
- 20 (1) the owners of a majority of the assessed value of
- 21 real property in the district that will be subject to the assessment
- 22 as determined by the most recent certified county property tax
- 23 rolls; or
- 24 (2) at least 25 persons who own land in the district
- 25 that will be subject to the assessment, if there are more than 25
- 26 persons who own property in the district that will be subject to the
- 27 assessment as determined by the most recent certified county

- 1 property tax rolls.
- 2 (c) Assessments, including assessments resulting from an
- 3 addition to or correction of the assessment roll by the district,
- 4 reassessments, penalties and interest on an assessment or
- 5 reassessment, expenses of collection, and reasonable attorney's
- 6 fees incurred by the district:
- 7 (1) are a first and prior lien against the property
- 8 assessed;
- 9 (2) are superior to any other lien or claim other than
- 10 a lien or claim for county, school district, or municipal ad valorem
- 11 taxes; and
- 12 (3) are the personal liability of and charge against
- 13 the owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the
- 14 assessment proceedings.
- 15 (d) The lien is effective from the date of the resolution of
- 16 the board imposing the assessment until the assessment is paid. The
- 17 board may enforce the lien in the same manner that the board may
- 18 enforce an ad valorem tax lien against real property.
- 19 SECTION 13. BONDS. (a) The district may issue bonds or
- 20 other obligations payable in whole or in part from ad valorem taxes,
- 21 assessments, impact fees, revenues, grants, or other money of the
- 22 district, or any combination of those sources of money, to pay for
- 23 any authorized purpose of the district.
- 24 (b) Bonds or other obligations of the district may be issued
- 25 in the form of bonds, notes, certificates of participation,
- 26 including other instruments evidencing a proportionate interest in
- 27 payments to be made by the district, or other obligations that are

- 1 issued in the exercise of the district's borrowing power and may be
- 2 issued in bearer or registered form or not represented by an
- 3 instrument but the transfer of which is registered on books
- 4 maintained by or on behalf of the district.
- 5 SECTION 14. DISBURSEMENTS OR TRANSFERS OF FUNDS. The board
- 6 by resolution shall establish the number of directors' signatures
- 7 and the procedure required for a disbursement or transfer of the
- 8 district's money.
- 9 SECTION 15. COMPETITIVE BIDDING. Section 49.273, Water
- 10 Code, applies to the district.
- 11 SECTION 16. INITIAL DIRECTORS. (a) The initial board
- 12 consists of the following persons:

- 19 (b) Of the initial directors, the terms of the first three
- 20 directors named in subsection (a) expire on May ____, 2006, and the

- 23 (d) This section expires September 1, 2006.
- 24 SECTION 17. The legislature finds that:
- 25 (1) proper and legal notice of the intention to
- 26 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 27 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a

- 1 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished by
- 3 the constitution and laws of this state, including the governor,
- 4 who has submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 5 Environmental Quality;
- 6 (2) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has
- 7 filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor,
- 8 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives
- 9 within the required time;
- 10 (3) the general law relating to consent by political
- 11 subdivisions to the creation of districts with conservation,
- 12 reclamation, and road powers and the inclusion of land in those
- districts has been complied with; and
- 14 (4) all requirements of the constitution and laws of
- 15 this state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with
- 16 respect to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act have
- 17 been fulfilled and accomplished.
- 18 SECTION 18. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 19 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 20 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 21 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 22 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
