4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The chapter heading of Chapter 607, Government
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 607. BENEFITS RELATING TO CERTAIN CONTAGIOUS
8	DISEASES AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS
9	SECTION 2. Section 607.002, Government Code, is amended to
10	read as follows:
11	Sec. 607.002. REIMBURSEMENT. A public safety employee who
12	is exposed to a contagious disease <u>or a hazardous material</u> is
13	entitled to reimbursement from the employing governmental entity
14	for reasonable medical expenses incurred in <u>receiving preventative</u>
15	medical treatment because of exposure to [for the prevention of]
16	the disease or the hazardous material if:
17	(1) the disease is not an "ordinary disease of life" as
18	that term is used in the context of a workers' compensation claim <u>or</u>
19	the hazardous material is one regulated by state or federal law as a
20	hazardous material;
21	(2) the exposure to the disease <u>or the hazardous</u>
22	<u>material</u> occurs during the course of the employment; and
23	(3) the employee requires preventative medical
24	treatment because of exposure to the disease or the hazardous

1 <u>material</u>.

2 SECTION 3. Section 607.003, Government Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

Sec. 607.003. PHYSICIAN OF CHOICE. A public safety employee who is exposed to a disease <u>or a hazardous material</u> described by Section 607.002 is entitled to <u>receive preventative</u> <u>medical treatment because of exposure to the</u> [be treated for the <u>prevention of that</u>] disease <u>or the hazardous material</u> by the physician of the employee's choice.

10 SECTION 4. Section 607.004, Government Code, is amended to 11 read as follows:

Sec. 607.004. PREVENTATIVE <u>MEDICAL TREATMENT</u>, IMMUNIZATIONS, 12 AND VACCINATIONS. 13 (a) A certified fire fighter or other governmental employee who operates an ambulance or who responds to 14 15 emergency medical calls is entitled to preventative medical 16 treatment or immunization for any disease or any hazardous material 17 to which the fire fighter or other governmental employee may be 18 exposed in performing official duties and for which preventative medical treatment or immunization is possible. 19

20 (b) The employee and any member of the employee's immediate 21 family are entitled to vaccination for a contagious disease to 22 which the employee is exposed during the course of employment.

(c) <u>The employee and any member of the employee's immediate</u> family are entitled to preventative medical treatment for any <u>hazardous material to which the employee is exposed during the</u> <u>course of employment.</u>

(d) The employing governmental entity may satisfy the

requirements of this section by: 1 2 (1) providing the preventative medical treatment, 3 immunization, or vaccination without charge; or 4 (2) reimbursing the employee for any necessary and 5 reasonable expenses incurred by the employee and any member of the employee's immediate family for the preventative medical 6 7 treatment, immunization, or vaccination. SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 8
