- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 505.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 505.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the
- 8 [Professional] Social Work Practice Act.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 505.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
- amending Subdivision (3) and adding Subdivisions (4-a) and (4-b) to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (3) "Council on Social Work Education" means the
- 13 national organization that is primarily responsible for the
- 14 accreditation of schools of social work in the United States or its
- 15 successor approved by the board.
- 16 (4-a) "Licensed baccalaureate social worker" means a
- 17 person who holds a baccalaureate social worker license issued by
- 18 the board under this chapter.
- 19 <u>(4-b) "Licensed clinical social worker" means a person</u>
- 20 who holds a clinical social worker license issued by the board under
- 21 <u>this chapter.</u>
- SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 505, Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 505.0025 to read as follows:
- Sec. 505.0025. PRACTICE OF SOCIAL WORK. (a) The practice

- of social work is the application of social work theory, knowledge,
- 2 methods, ethics, and the professional use of self to restore or
- 3 enhance social, psychosocial, or biopsychosocial functioning of
- 4 individuals, couples, families, groups, organizations, or
- 5 communities.
- 6 (b) The practice of social work may include the provision of
- 7 individual, conjoint, family, and group psychotherapy using the
- 8 <u>Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, the</u>
- 9 <u>International Classification of Diseases</u>, and other diagnostic
- 10 classification systems in assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and
- other activities by a person licensed under this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 505.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 505.003. APPLICATIONS AND EXEMPTIONS. (a) This
- 15 chapter does not apply to:
- 16 (1) an activity conducted or a service performed by a
- 17 person who is licensed, certified, or registered in a profession
- other than social work, including a physician, attorney, registered
- 19 nurse, licensed vocational nurse, psychologist, occupational
- 20 therapist, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed
- 21 chemical dependency counselor, or licensed professional counselor,
- 22 if:
- 23 (A) the activity or service is conducted or
- 24 performed within the scope of the person's license, certificate, or
- 25 registration; [and]
- 26 (B) the person does not use a title listed in
- 27 Section 505.351; and

- 18 licensed under this chapter [licensed master social worker,
- 19 licensed social worker, or social work associate].
- SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 505.101, Occupations
- 21 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The Texas State Board of Social Worker Examiners
- 23 consists of nine members appointed by the governor with the advice
- 24 and consent of the senate as follows:
- 25 (1) two [three] members who are licensed master social
- 26 workers[, at least two of whom are recognized as advanced clinical
- 27 practitioners];

- Sec. 505.206. ROSTER OF [PRIVATE AND] INDEPENDENT SOCIAL
- 27 WORKERS. The board shall publish a roster of persons recognized

- 1 under Section 505.307 as qualified for the [private and]
- 2 independent practice of social work.
- 3 SECTION 9. Subsection (a), Section 505.254, Occupations
- 4 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The board shall adopt rules concerning the
- 6 investigation of a complaint filed with the department and referred
- 7 to the board. The rules adopted under this subsection must:
- 8 (1) distinguish among categories of complaints;
- 9 (2) ensure that a complaint is not dismissed without
- 10 appropriate consideration;
- 11 (3) require that the board be advised of a complaint
- that is dismissed and that a letter be sent to the person who filed

- 21 for license holders under this chapter who are licensed [master
- 22 <u>social workers</u>] in good standing if establishment of the specialty
- 23 areas [area]:
- 24 (1) is necessary to promote the public interest; and
- 25 (2) assists the public in identifying qualified
- 26 persons in a social work practice specialty [the profession who
- 27 perform specialty social work].

- 1 (b) The board may not authorize a specialty <u>area within the</u>
 2 <u>practice of social work unless the board sets the minimum</u>
 3 <u>qualifications</u> for [the private practice of social work except for a licensed master social worker who satisfies the minimum number of
- 5 years of active] social work practice with appropriate supervision
- 6 and examination, as determined by the board.
- 7 SECTION 12. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 505.303, 8 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 9 (b) A person may not use the title "Licensed Clinical Social
 10 Worker" ["Advanced Clinical Practitioner"] or the initials "LCSW"
 11 ["A.C.P."] unless the person is recognized as qualified for the
 12 independent practice of clinical social work.
- 13 (c) For purposes of Article 21.52, Insurance Code:
- 14 (1) a person recognized as qualified for the
- 15 <u>independent</u> practice of clinical social work may use the title
- 16 "Licensed Clinical Social Worker" ["Advanced Clinical
- 17 Practitioner"] or another [other] title approved by the board; and
- 18 (2) a board-approved title under this subsection has
- 19 the same meaning and effect as the title "Licensed Clinical Social
- 20 Worker." ["Advanced Clinical Practitioner."]
- 21 SECTION 13. Sections 505.305, 505.306, 505.307, and
- 22 505.351, Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 505.305. RECOGNITION OF SPECIALTY; ISSUANCE OF ORDER.
- 24 (a) The board shall recognize a [licensed master] social worker as
- 25 qualified for the practice of a specialty area of social work if the
- 26 [licensed master] social worker satisfies the recognition
- 27 requirements established by the board and the board determines that

- the person is worthy of the public trust in performing services within the scope of the specialty area.
- 3 (b) The board shall issue an order of recognition of 4 specialty to a [licensed master] social worker who is recognized as
- 5 qualified for the practice of a specialty area of social work. The
- 6 order of recognition of specialty evidences the state's recognition
- 7 of the [licensed master] social worker as a specialty social work
- 8 practitioner under the [professional] identification or title
- 9 designated by the board.
- Sec. 505.306. PROHIBITED USE OF SPECIALTY AREA
- 11 IDENTIFICATION OR TITLE. If the board establishes a specialty area
- of social work, a [licensed master] social worker may not use the
- 13 specialty area [professional] identification or title designated
- 14 by the board unless the person is recognized as qualified for the
- 15 practice of the specialty area under this chapter.
- 16 Sec. 505.307. [PRIVATE AND] INDEPENDENT PRACTICE
- 17 RECOGNITION; MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS. (a) The board shall
- 18 establish procedures for recognizing a [licensed master] social
- 19 worker qualified for the [private and] independent practice of
- 20 social work.
- 21 (b) A [licensed master] social worker may not be recognized
- 22 as qualified for the [private and] independent practice of social
- 23 work unless the person satisfies the requirements of social work
- 24 <u>education</u>, experience, and supervision [minimum number of years of
- 25 acceptable social work experience] as determined by the board.
- 26 [(c) A licensed social worker or social work associate is
- 27 not eligible for recognition as qualified for the private and

independent practice of social work.

- 2 Sec. 505.351. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not use
- 3 or cause to be used the title "social worker," "licensed
- 4 baccalaureate social worker," "licensed master social worker,"
- 5 <u>"licensed clinical social worker," or</u> "licensed social worker," [or
- 6 "social work associate,"] or any combination, variation, or
- 7 abbreviation of those titles, as a professional or business
- 8 identification, representation, asset, or means of obtaining a
- 9 benefit unless the person holds an appropriate license issued under
- 10 this chapter.

- 11 (b) A person may not use a title that implies that the person
- 12 holds a license in [professional] social work unless the person
- 13 holds an appropriate license issued under this chapter.
- 14 (c) A person who engages in or attempts to engage in conduct
- 15 described by this section is considered to be engaged in the
- 16 practice of [professional] social work.
- SECTION 14. Subsection (b), Section 505.353, Occupations
- 18 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) An applicant may take the licensing examination
- 20 conducted by the board under Section 505.354 for:
- 21 (1) a master social worker license if the applicant
- 22 possesses a doctoral or master's degree in social work from a
- 23 graduate program accredited by the Council on Social Work
- 24 Education;
- 25 (2) a baccalaureate social worker license if the
- 26 applicant possesses a baccalaureate degree in social work from an
- 27 educational program accredited by the Council on Social Work

- 1 Education; or
- 2 (3) <u>a clinical social worker license if the applicant</u>
- 3 possesses a doctoral or master's degree in social work from an
- 4 accredited graduate program approved by the board and meets the
- 5 qualifications for clinical social work practice as determined by
- 6 the board under this chapter [a social work associate license if the
- 7 applicant:

- 23 social worker [or social work associate, as appropriate,] in
