4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Article 14.03(g), Code of Criminal Procedure, is

6 amended to read as follows:

- 7 (g)(1) A peace officer listed in Subdivision (4), Article
- 8 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, may arrest a person who anywhere
- 9 in this state commits an offense within the officer's presence or
- 10 view, including an offense under Subtitle C, Title 7,
- 11 Transportation Code.
- 12 <u>(2)</u> A peace officer listed in Subdivision (1), (2),
- 13 (3), $[\frac{(4)}{7}]$ or (5), Article 2.12, who is licensed under Chapter 1701
- 14 [415], Occupations [Government] Code, and is outside of the
- 15 officer's jurisdiction may arrest without a warrant a person who
- 16 <u>anywhere in this state</u> commits an [any] offense within the
- 17 officer's presence or view, except that an officer described by
- 18 this subdivision who is outside the officer's jurisdiction may
- 19 arrest a person for a violation of Subtitle C, Title 7,
- 20 Transportation Code, only if the offense is committed in the county
- in which the peace officer serves as an elected official or in which
- the law enforcement agency employing the peace officer is located
- 23 [officer is listed in Subdivision (4), Article 2.12].
- 24 (3) A peace officer making an arrest under this

- 1 subsection shall as soon as practicable after making the arrest
- 2 notify a law enforcement agency having jurisdiction where the
- 3 arrest was made. The law enforcement agency shall then take custody
- 4 of the person committing the offense and take the person before a
- 5 magistrate in compliance with Article 14.06.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
