## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an interim planning commission for the Medicaid and
3	State Child Health Plan programs.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. CREATION OF INTERIM PLANNING COMMISSION.
6	(a) The Medicaid and State Child Health Plan Program Interim
7	Planning Commission is composed of:
8	(1) 11 members appointed by the governor, including:
9	(A) one member representing primary care
10	physicians;
11	(B) one member representing health care benefit
12	plan issuers;
13	(C) one member representing non-profit
14	hospitals;
15	(D) one member representing a county that
16	transfers tax revenues under the disproportionate share program;
17	(E) one member representing children's
18	hospitals;
19	(F) one member representing medical specialists;
20	(G) one member representing the uninsured; and
21	(H) one member representing community-based
22	alternative programs;
23	(I) one member representing long-term care
24	providers;

- 1 (J) one member representing community mental
- 2 health and mental retardation centers established under Subchapter
- 3 A, Chapter 534, Health and Safety Code.
- 4 (2) five members appointed by the lieutenant governor,
- 5 including four members who are members of the senate; and
- 6 (3) five members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 7 of representatives, including four members who are members of the
- 8 house of representatives.
- 9 (b) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 10 representatives shall each appoint a co-presiding officer of the
- 11 commission from among the members of the commission.
- 12 SECTION 2. DUTIES. (a) The commission shall study the
- 13 overall effectiveness of the Medicaid and State Child Health Plan
- 14 programs and evaluate:
- 15 (1) the effect of any changes to the programs
- 16 resulting from changes in federal law or regulation, including any
- 17 new waiver initiatives, and the effect on the Medicaid program of
- opting to receive a federal Medicaid block grant, if available; and
- 19 (2) the effectiveness of this state's current health
- 20 care spending, including an identification of areas and programs
- 21 that are not using the maximum available amount of federal funding
- 22 and that could be improved through use of new federal waivers or
- 23 expansion of current pilot programs.
- (b) In evaluating the option of a federal Medicaid block
- 25 grant, the commission shall:
- 26 (1) seek input of all major stakeholders regarding the
- 27 manner in which that option would improve services currently

- 1 available under the Medicaid and State Child Health Plan programs;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) identify how each affected stakeholder would be
- 4 positively affected by implementation of that option.
- 5 SECTION 3. FUNDING. Amounts reasonably required by the
- 6 commission to perform its duties under this Act, as well as
- 7 necessary administrative support, shall be provided cooperatively
- 8 by the office of the governor, the senate, and the house of
- 9 representatives using existing resources otherwise available to
- 10 those entities.
- 11 SECTION 4. REPORT. Not later than November 1, 2004, the
- 12 commission shall deliver a report of its conclusions to the
- 13 legislature, the governor, and appropriate state agencies with
- 14 oversight of the Medicaid and State Child Health Plan programs. The
- 15 report must include recommendations for:
- 16 (1) planning necessary to assure the continued
- operation of the Medicaid and State Child Health Plan programs for a
- 18 10-year period; and
- 19 (2) actions necessary to assure that the state takes
- 20 full advantage of all options available under the Medicaid and
- 21 State Child Health Plan programs to better support all stakeholders
- in the programs.
- 23 SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. The commission is abolished
- 24 September 1, 2005.
- 25 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 26 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all members
- 27 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas

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- 1 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 2 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
