- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Virtual Charter
- 6 Schools Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 12.002, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 12.002. CLASSES OF CHARTER. The classes of charter
- 10 under this chapter are:
- 11 (1) a home-rule school district charter as provided by
- 12 Subchapter B;
- 13 (2) a campus or campus program charter as provided by
- 14 Subchapter C; or
- 15 (3) an open-enrollment charter as provided by
- 16 Subchapter D or Subchapter E.
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 12.151, Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 12.151. <u>DEFINITIONS</u> [<u>DEFINITION</u>]. In this subchapter:
- 20 <u>(1) "Educational activities"</u> means the student
- 21 activities described in the charter of a virtual charter school,
- 22 the participation in which counts towards a student's minimum
- 23 required hours of instruction as determined in accordance with
- 24 Section 12.153(a).

- 1 (2)[7] "Public [public] senior college or university"
- 2 has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 3 (3) "Public senior college or university charter
- 4 school" means any open-enrollment charter school authorized and
- 5 operated in accordance with this subchapter.
- 6 (4) "Virtual charter school" means any
- 7 open-enrollment charter school authorized and operated in
- 8 <u>accordance with this subchapter that utilizes technology to deliver</u>
- 9 <u>a significant portion of instruction through the Internet or in a</u>
- 10 virtual or remote setting to students within the state.
- 11 SECTION 4. Section 12.152, Education Code, is amended by
- 12 adding Subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 13 (b) In accordance with this subchapter and Subchapter D, the
- 14 State Board of Education may grant a charter on the application of a
- 15 public senior college or university for a virtual charter school.
- SECTION 5. Sections 12.153 and 12.154, Education Code, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 12.153. RULES. (a) Each virtual charter school
- 19 shall:
- 20 (1) for the purpose of determining the amount of state
- 21 funds available for a virtual charter school under Section 12.106,
- 22 <u>develop a mechanism to determine the number of hours of educational</u>
- 23 activities completed by a virtual charter school student that is
- 24 the equivalent of one day of school attendance;
- 25 (2) provide each of its students with access to a
- 26 curriculum that meets or exceeds state academic standards;
- 27 (3) assess the academic performance of each of the

- 1 charter school's students at least once per week during the
- 2 academic year in each core curriculum subject area;
- 3 (4) notwithstanding Section 12.107, make available to
- 4 the parent or guardian of each enrolled student: physical copies of
- 5 instructional materials related to each student's curriculum; a
- 6 computer and printer; and reimbursement for an Internet connection
- 7 to be <u>used for school work;</u>
- 8 (5) employ teachers who are certified under Subchapter
- 9 B, Chapter 21;
- 10 (6) maintain a teacher-to-student ratio of at least
- one teacher for every 60 students;
- 12 <u>(7) require its teachers to be available at least four</u>
- times each academic year to meet with the parent or guardian of each
- of the teacher's students; and
- 15 (8) maintain an administrative office in the county in
- 16 which the school's charter holder is located.
- 17 (b) An administrative office maintained by a virtual
- 18 charter school according to Subsection (a)(8) shall be considered
- 19 the principal place of business of the virtual charter school.
- 20 (c) A virtual charter school may not:
- 21 (1) make any payment, in cash or cash equivalents,
- 22 other than payments required to provide the items described in
- 23 <u>Subsection (a)(4);</u> or
- 24 (2) prohibit a student from working at a different
- 25 grade level in any subject.
- 26 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement the
- 27 requirements for virtual charter schools under Subsections (a),

- 1 (b), and (c).
- 2 <u>(e)</u> The commissioner may adopt <u>additional</u> rules to
- 3 implement any other provision of this subchapter.
- 4 Sec. 12.154. CONTENT. Notwithstanding Section 12.110(d),
- 5 the State Board of Education may grant a charter under this
- 6 subchapter only if the following criteria are satisfied in the
- 7 public senior college's or university's application, as determined
- 8 by the State Board of Education:
- 9 (1) the <u>public senior</u> college or university charter
- 10 school's educational program must include innovative teaching
- 11 methods;
- 12 (2) the public senior college or university charter
- 13 school's educational program must be implemented under the direct
- 14 supervision of a member of the teaching or research faculty of the
- 15 public senior college or university;
- 16 (3) the faculty member supervising the <u>public senior</u>
- 17 college or university charter school's educational program must
- 18 have substantial experience and expertise in education research,
- 19 teacher education, classroom instruction, or educational
- 20 administration;
- 21 (4) the public senior college or university charter
- 22 school's educational program must be designed to meet specific
- 23 goals described in the charter, including improving student
- 24 performance, and each aspect of the program must be directed toward
- 25 the attainment of the goals;
- 26 (5) the attainment of the public senior college or
- 27 university charter school's educational program goals must be

- 1 measured using specific, objective standards set forth in the
- 2 charter, including assessment methods and a time frame; and
- 3 (6) the financial operations of the public senior
- 4 college or university charter school must be supervised by the
- 5 business office of the public senior college or university.
- 6 SECTION 6. Subsection (a), Section 12.156, Education Code,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter,
- 9 Subchapter D applies to a <u>public senior</u> college or university
- 10 charter school as though the public senior college or university
- 11 charter school were granted a charter under that subchapter.
- 12 SECTION 7. Subchapter E, Chapter 12, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 12.157 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 12.157. ANNUAL EVALUATION OF VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOLS.
- 15 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 12.118, each public
- 16 <u>senior college or university sponsoring a virtual charter school</u>
- 17 under this subchapter shall perform an annual evaluation of the
- 18 <u>virtual charter school.</u>
- 19 (b) An evaluation under Subsection (a) must include an
- 20 analysis of:
- 21 (1) any increase in student achievement, measured
- 22 <u>according to the charter of the virtual charter school and state</u>
- 23 academic standards;
- 24 (2) the academic, fiscal, and operational performance
- of the virtual charter school; and
- 26 (3) the assessment test scores for any of the virtual
- 27 charter school's students who take any of the state assessment
