(b) A student enrolled in a virtual charter school $comple\overline{te}$:

(1) at least 720 hours of educational activities each school year if the student is enrolled in grade two or lower; and (2) at least 900 hours of educational activities each

school year if the student is enrolled in grade three or higher.

A teacher employed by a virtual charter school: (c) must be appropriately certified under Subchapter

B, Chapter 21; and (2) shall, at least four times each school year, be available to meet with the parent or legal quardian of each student

enrolled in the teacher's class. (d) A virtual charter school is entitled for each student in average daily attendance to funding at a level equal to an open-enrollment charter school.

A public senior college or university that holds charter for a virtual charter school shall annually conduct an evaluation of the school, including an analysis of:

(1) any increase in student achievement, as measured

using state academic standards and standards described by the charter;

(2) the academic, fiscal, and operational performance

of the school; and
(3) the performance of any students who are assessed using an assessment instrument adopted under Section 39.023.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
