1 or employee incentive programs; 2 (6) the quality, availability and prices of its goods 3 or services; or 4 (7) other aspects of the operation of the business or 5 governmental entity, as determined by the business or governmental 6 entity, not otherwise prohibited by this chapter. (b) A person satisfies the requirements of subsection (a) of 7 8 this section if: (1) an individual who poses or acts anonymously as a 9 customer or client of the business or governmental entity: 10 (i) is qualified and trained in its evaluation 11 12 practices and procedures by the person or entity engaged in offering or providing the services described in this section; 13 (ii) uses an evaluation tool prescribed or 14 15 approved by the business or governmental entity seeking the 16 evaluation; and 17 (iii) does not engage in the investigation or observation of one or more of its employees or agents for the 18 19 purpose of determining whether an employee has committed a crime; 20 and 21 (2) the information obtained through the use of the evaluation tool is not used by the business or governmental entity 22 as the sole basis for the discipline or discharge of one or more of 23 24 its employees or agents. 25 SECTION 2.
