4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 371.157, Finance Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 371.157. PAWN TICKET. A pawnbroker, at the time a pawn
8	transaction is entered, shall deliver to the pledgor a pawn ticket
9	or other memorandum that clearly shows:
10	(1) the name and address of the pawnshop;
11	(2) the pledgor's name, address, and physical
12	description and a driver's license number, military identification
13	number, identification certificate number, or other official
14	number that can identify the pledgor;
15	(3) the date of the transaction;
16	(4) an identification and description of the pledged
17	goods, including serial numbers if reasonably available;
18	(5) the amount of cash advanced or credit extended to
19	the pledgor, designated as "Amount Financed";
20	(6) the amount of the pawn service charge, designated
21	as "Finance Charge";
22	(7) the total amount, consisting of the amount
23	financed plus the finance charge, that must be paid to redeem the
24	pledged goods on the maturity date, designated as "Total of

No. 965 1 Payments"; (8) the "Annual Percentage Rate," computed according 2 to regulations issued by the Federal Reserve Board under the Truth 3 4 in Lending Act (15 U.S.C. Section 1601 et seq.), as amended; 5 (9) the maturity date of the pawn transaction; and 6 (10) a statement that: the pledgor is not obligated to redeem the 7 (A) 8 pledged goods; and 9 (B) the pledged goods may be forfeited to the pawnbroker on the <u>31st</u> [61st] day after the maturity date. 10 SECTION 2. Section 371.174(b), Finance Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12 Identification is acceptable only if it contains a 13 (b) 14 photograph of the pledgor or seller and is: 15 a state driver's license; 16 (2) a state identification card; 17 (3) a passport; a military identification; 18 (4) 19 (5) a certificate of identification from the Mexican Consulate, certificado de matricula consular [nonresident alien 20 21 border crossing card]; or identification issued by the agency of the United 22 (6) States responsible for citizenship and immigration [a resident 23 24 alien border crossing card; or [(7) a United States Immigration and Naturalization 25 26 Service identification]. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003. 27
