- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (f), Section 53.002, Government Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (f) The judges of the 12th, 106th, 258th, and 278th district
- 8 courts may each appoint a bailiff. At the discretion of the judge,
- 9 a bailiff may serve the court in each county of the district.
- 10 SECTION 2. Subsection (k), Section 53.009, Government Code,
- 11 is amended to read as follows:
- 12 (k) The bailiffs of the 12th, 84th, 106th, 258th, and 278th
- 13 district courts are entitled to receive a salary set by the judge
- 14 and approved by the commissioners court of each of the counties in
- 15 which the bailiff is designated to serve, except that the amount of
- 16 the salary paid the bailiff of the 84th District Court must be
- 17 commensurate with the salary paid the bailiffs of other courts with
- 18 similar duties. The salary shall be apportioned by the judge among
- 19 the counties in which the bailiff is designated to serve. The judge
- 20 shall give each commissioners court in the district written
- 21 notification of the amount of compensation to be paid by the county.
- 22 The salary is paid out of the general fund of each county.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
