1-8 relating to the appointment of a bailiff for the 106th District
1-9 Court.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Subsection (f), Section 53.002, Government Code,
1-12 is amended to read as follows:

1-13 (f) The judges of the 12th, 106th, 258th, and 278th district
1-14 courts may each appoint a bailiff. At the discretion of the judge,
1-15 a bailiff may serve the court in each county of the district.

1-16 SECTION 2. Subsection (k), Section 53.009, Government Code,
1-17 is amended to read as follows:

1-18 (k) The bailiffs of the 12th, 84th, 106th, 258th, and 278th
1-19 district courts are entitled to receive a salary set by the judge
1-20 and approved by the commissioners court of each of the counties in
1-21 which the bailiff is designated to serve, except that the amount of
1-22 the salary paid the bailiff of the 84th District Court must be
1-23 commensurate with the salary paid the bailiffs of other courts with
1-24 similar duties. The salary shall be apportioned by the judge among
1-25 the counties in which the bailiff is designated to serve. The judge
1-26 shall give each commissioners court in the district written
1-27 notification of the amount of compensation to be paid by the county.
1-28 The salary is paid out of the general fund of each county.

1-29 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
