A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to domestic preparedness training programs for certain law
3	enforcement officers.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1701.258 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1701.258. DOMESTIC PREPAREDNESS TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR
8	LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Domestic preparedness training" means training
10	for law enforcement personnel that relates to:
11	(A) preparing to respond and responding to
12	weapons of mass destruction;
13	(B) identifying and disposing of unexploded
14	weaponry; or
15	(C) managing, preparing to respond to, and
16	responding to a terrorist incident.
17	(2) "Law enforcement department" means:
18	(A) the Department of Public Safety of the State
19	of Texas; and
20	(B) a department of a municipality, county, port
21	authority, navigation district, or airport authority that:
22	(i) employs persons who are certified by
23	the commission as peace officers; and
24	(ii) has jurisdiction that includes an

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- 1 airport that services a commercial airline carrier or a seaport.
- 2 (b) Subject to available funding, a law enforcement
- 3 department shall implement a program of domestic preparedness
- 4 training for its law enforcement officers that includes
- 5 instructional or informational domestic preparedness training
- 6 courses certified by the commission.
- 7 <u>(c) The commission shall apply for federal funding</u>
- 8 <u>available</u> for domestic preparedness training of law enforcement
- 9 officers. If the commission obtains a federal grant for domestic
- 10 preparedness training of law enforcement officers, the commission
- 11 shall:
- 12 (1) develop requirements, including requirements for
- 13 sponsors and curriculum, and procedures for domestic preparedness
- training courses to be certified by the commission;
- 15 (2) review and certify appropriate domestic
- 16 preparedness training courses that meet the commission's
- 17 requirements and procedures for certification;
- 18 (3) not later than February 1 of each year, allocate to
- 19 law enforcement departments federal grant money to assist the law
- 20 enforcement departments in implementing domestic preparedness
- 21 training programs under this section; and
- 22 (4) provide other appropriate assistance to law
- 23 <u>enforcement departments to assist them in implementing domestic</u>
- 24 preparedness training programs under this section.
- 25 (d) The commission shall administer a grant program under
- 26 this section in accordance with federal and state guidelines and
- 27 may not use more than three percent of the grant funds for

- 1 <u>administration of the grant program.</u>
- 2 (e) A law enforcement department must, on request of the
- 3 commission, provide timely information to help the commission
- 4 determine the appropriate allocation of funding under this section
- 5 for that law enforcement department.
- 6 <u>(f) The head of a law enforcement department must maintain a</u>
- 7 <u>complete and detailed written record of any federal money related</u>
- 8 to domestic preparedness training that the law enforcement
- 9 <u>department receives from the commission and is required to spend in</u>
- 10 <u>accordance with this section</u>. The commission may audit any funding
- 11 received under this section by a law enforcement department for a
- 12 domestic preparedness training program. The state auditor may
- audit any money spent by a law enforcement department for a domestic
- 14 preparedness training program under this section.
- SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2004, the Commission on
- 16 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education shall:
- 17 (1) apply for federal funding available for domestic
- 18 preparedness training of law enforcement officers as required by
- 19 Section 1701.258, Occupations Code, as added by this Act;
- 20 (2) develop procedures to administer a federal grant
- 21 program for domestic preparedness training of law enforcement
- officers in accordance with that section; and
- 23 (3) develop requirements and procedures for
- 24 certification of appropriate domestic preparedness training
- 25 courses as required by that section.
- SECTION 3. Not later than March 1, 2004, the Commission on
- 27 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education shall review and

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- 1 certify appropriate domestic preparedness training courses
- 2 available through Texas A&M University's Texas Engineering
- 3 Extension Service and its National Emergency Response and Rescue
- 4 Training Center that meet the requirements and procedures for
- 5 certification developed by the commission.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
