- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 572, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 572.059 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 572.059. INDEPENDENCE OF STATE AND LOCAL OFFICERS
- 8 ACTING IN LEGISLATIVE CAPACITY. (a) In this section, "legislative
- 9 measure" includes:
- 10 <u>(1) a bill, resolution, order, or other proposal to</u>
- 11 adopt, enact, amend, or repeal a statute, ordinance, rule, or
- 12 policy of general application;
- 13 (2) a proposal to adopt, enact, amend, or repeal, or to
- 14 grant a variance or other exception to, a zoning ordinance; or
- 15 (3) a proposed constitutional amendment or charter
- amendment subject to a vote of the electorate.
- (b) For purposes of Subsection (a), a measure that is
- 18 applicable to a class or subset of persons or matters that is
- 19 <u>defined in general terms without naming the particular persons or</u>
- 20 <u>matters is a measure of general application.</u>
- 21 (c) To protect the independence of state and local officers
- 22 acting in a legislative capacity, a state or local officer, whether
- 23 elected or appointed, including a member of the governing body of a
- 24 school district or other political subdivision of this state, may

- 1 not be subject to disciplinary action or a sanction, penalty,
- 2 disability, or liability for:
- 3 (1) an action permitted by law that the officer takes
- 4 in the officer's official capacity regarding a legislative measure;
- 5 (2) proposing, endorsing, or expressing support for or
- 6 opposition to a legislative measure or taking any action permitted
- 7 by law to support or oppose a legislative measure;
- 8 (3) the effect of a legislative measure or of a change
- 9 in law proposed by a legislative measure on any person; or
- 10 (4) a breach of duty, in connection with the member's
- 11 practice of or employment in a licensed or regulated profession or
- 12 occupation, to disclose to any person information, or to obtain a
- 13 waiver or consent from any person, regarding:
- 14 (A) the officer's actions relating to a
- 15 <u>legislative measure; or</u>
- 16 (B) the substance, effects, or potential effects
- of a legislative measure.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
