5	SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 250.006, Health and
6	Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	(b) A person [ <del>convicted of an offense under Chapter 31,</del>
8	Penal Code, that is punishable as a felony may not be employed in a
9	position the duties of which involve direct contact with a consumer
10	in a facility before the fifth anniversary of the date the person is
11	<pre>convicted of:</pre>
12	(1) an offense under Section 22.01, Penal Code
13	(assault), that is punishable as a Class A misdemeanor or as a
14	<pre>felony;</pre>
15	(2) an offense under Section 30.02, Penal Code
16	(burglary);
17	(3) an offense under Chapter 31, Penal Code (theft),
18	that is punishable as a felony;
19	(4) an offense under Section 32.45, Penal Code
20	(misapplication of fiduciary property or property of a financial
21	institution), that is punishable as a Class A misdemeanor or a
22	felony; or
23	(5) an offense under Section 32.46, Penal Code
24	(securing execution of a document by deception), that is punishable

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- 1 <u>as a Class A misdemeanor or a felony</u> [the conviction].
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
