4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 28.0252 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 28.0252. HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION PILOT PROJECT. (a)
8	The commissioner shall establish a pilot project in five school
9	districts selected by the commissioner under which the agency:
10	(1) examines patterns in student advancement through
11	the educational system from kindergarten through high school;
12	(2) identifies obstacles interfering with the ability
13	of students to graduate from high school, such as unavailability of
14	early childhood services, including Head Start program services,
15	unavailability of sufficient numbers of certified teachers in
16	particular subject areas and at particular grade levels, student
17	difficulties in particular subject areas, and difficulties
18	associated with the provision of bilingual education services; and
19	(3) determines specific recommendations for
20	addressing and removing the obstacles identified under Subdivision
21	<u>(2).</u>
22	(b) In addition to the requirements described by Subsection
23	(a), the pilot project in one of the five school districts must
24	include a focus on dual language immersion programs authorized by

- 1 Section 28.0051 and the effect of those programs on a student's
- 2 <u>ability to graduate from high school.</u>
- 3 (c) Not later than January 15 of 2005 and 2007, the agency
- 4 shall submit a report to the legislature describing the agency's
- 5 activities under the pilot project and the recommendations arising
- from the project.
- 7 (d) This section expires September 1, 2007.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
